The Church is situated in the centre of the village of Kirkby Malham to the west of the main street. It is part of the Diocese of Leeds within the Church of England. The correspondence address is The Vicarage, Kirkby Malham, Skipton, North Yorkshire, BD23 4BS.

During 2019 the Parochial Church Council (PCC) has been registered as a charity with the Charity Commission.

The last Annual Parochial Church meeting was held on 25th April 2019.

The Electoral Roll has been updated and now consists of 78 members.

This is divided into 63 residents and 15 non residents.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. The PCC Safeguarding procedures are fully compliant with Diocesan instructions. All PCC members have completed a DBS check.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

6meetings of the PCC were held and the average attendance was 10 members.

CHURCH ATTENDANCE

The mean weekly adult attendance at services was 40.06 (2018 – 44.71). The median value for Sunday services was 29 (2017 – 32). These measures include repeat weekly attendances. Excluding weddings and funerals the total adult attendance at services was 2083 (2017-2325).

THANKS, ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The Interregnum continued with our grateful thanks to all our Clergy supporters enabling us to maintain our weekly Eucharist Services on Sunday Mornings. The Churchwardens and PCC members met with Bishop Helen-Ann who explained the process of uniting the Benefices. The Churchwardens then went on to meet with the Churchwardens from Gargrave and Coniston Cold to prepare for the Sections 11 and 12 meetings, leading to the appointment of the Reverend Andrew Steer as Vicar of the three parishes in July and his Licensing at Gargrave on the 14th November. We now look forward to the process of appointing a House for Duty person for Kirkby Malham to assist Andrew in his ministry.

The PCC again records its thanks to the Churchwardens, Mo Dore, Ted Ellis and George Parker.

The Church is reliant on the many who give tirelessly of their time and experience especially during the interregnum. These include the PCC secretary, Treasurers, PCC members, organists and choir, sacristan, Altar assistants, children's club leaders, Music Group, flower arrangers, readers and intercessors, church welcomers, church cleaners who ensure that our kitchen area and toilets are always ready for the many visitors who like to avail themselves of the facilities, the churchyard maintenance team, the Fabric Group, the 200 club organisers and the bell-ringers who welcome you to church every Sunday. We also thank John Mitchell, our independent examiner for his work in vetting this report and checking the financial statements. We sadly say farewell to Carol and Ian Ballard who have left the Dale and we wish to record our thanks to them for all they did for the church during their time here.

Margaret Ellis and her team continue school visits with the "Openthe Book". Once again, we thank the schoolchildren for their entertaining Christingle performance which was very well attended as were the Christmas services.

We maintain our ties with the City of Sanctuary Maternity Stream who again visited us in October. And once again we hosted the Voices of Craven annual concert.

The PCC are as ever grateful for all the help given by volunteers to ensure the smooth running of all church activities, especially Dorothy with the coffee and biscuits team, The Bookstall and Card Sales and the Foodbank.

This year the church has hosted two weddings and sadly seven funeral services, including two staunch members of the congregation, John Syme Taylor and George Bolland.

PCC Report for 2019

FINANCE

The surplus for the year on the General Fund of £2,913, but an expected invoice received after the year end would have reduced this by £1,073. It also has to be noted that there have been some exceptional receipts including funeral fees and collections dedicated to the ongoing work of the church. We have received two bequests totalling £3,500.

The parish share of £22,549 was paid in full. Transition to the new Share basis is now completed. The new clergy arrangements within the benefice means that will not get the expected further reductions and the share will remain at the current or slightly higher level going forward. It is some £4,000 less than we had to pay in 2015.

A number of factors, both positive and negative, influenced the favourable outcome. Total income was comparable with 2018 other than the large bequest received which raised the 2018 number. We also received from the Malham Safari committee a donation of £3,000 (2018: £3,500). A huge amount of effort goes into making the annual 'Safari' a success and the PCC acknowledges the generous support this event has provided over many years financially, in terms of assistance from church members during the event itself and, of course, the committee of planners and doers. 2019 was again a very busy year for both weddings and funerals and revenue from the associated fees was £4039 (2018: £3940) with collection monies from those services correspondingly increased. Of the collections £2709 was passed directly to nominated charities other than the church itself and does not appear in the accounts.

The Malhamdale Trail Challenge, did take place in 2019 and the PCC was pleased to receive £750 from its operating surplus.

Costs have again been well controlled. Oil costs have fallen slightly so despite the church being warmer with its more efficient heating system there was a reduction of £400 in the charges. The honorarium paid to the editor of the parish magazine shows the full year effect. The higher figure for Upkeep of Services of £4720 (2018: £1219) is due to the organ repair, £2,000, noted but not paid in 2018, and the new alter frontal purchased in memory of Mary Cribb. The related donation is registered within note 2.

As last year, it is pleasing to be able to report a surplus, but there is no room for complacency. While we can, to a certain degree, manage our operating costs, our revenues are largely determined by factors outside of our control. As an example fee income in 2012 was only £150, almost £4000 less than that received this year. Our regular monthly income is not increasing to keep place with inflation and there is no certainty that we will enjoy in 2020 the same level of income from other sources that we have received in the last two years.

The year end balance on General Fund was £18,252 (2017 £15,338) and the total financial resources was £58,662 (2018: £55,122.)

CHURCH FABRIC

The Fabric Group has met as required to ensure that the church remains in good condition. The latest Quinquennial Report, which was received on 6th October, contained very few items requiring urgent attention. All of these have been dealt with except some pointing work which will be done in the spring. A start has been made on the other items on the Report to ensure that we address every item to which our attention has been drawn. Most of the work has been done by members of the Group and for this the PCC is most gratefull.

Where the fencing in the churchyard blew down, we are developing a wild flower area over the next few years. We had to obtain full planning permission to move the fence to enable the sheep to continue to graze the section of the graveyard by the Settle road. A leak on the roof on the South aisle which occurs when there is a strong south west wind is proving difficult to resolve. Our church architect and the contractor (JTC) are working on this to identify a solution.
