Trustees' Report

The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2019.

LEGAL STATUS

The Gloucestershire Chinese Women's Guild is a company limited by guarantee and is registered with the Charity Commissioners. As a company limited by guarantee, the Guild has no share capital and the liability of the members on liquidation is limited to £1.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CHARITY

The objectives of the Charity are to provide help and support for the Chinese community in Gloucestershire, especially Chinese women and their families, asylum seekers and refugees, by the provision of services not otherwise provided by statutory bodies.

The Gloucestershire Chinese Women's Guild is the only organisation that cares for most disadvantaged members of the Chinese community in Gloucestershire. Through social welfare and advocacy, we improve the lives of the young and old of all ages; the infirm and disabled; the dispossessed because of poverty, social or economic circumstances; asylum seekers, refugees, and new immigrants.

Our staff are fully trained for advocacy, interpreting, filling official documents such as welfare benefit forms and interviews with local authorities etc. We devote our concentration and effort on our works, which have immeasurable benefit to the community.

OBJECTIVES

Income and property held by the Guild is applied solely toward the promotion of the objectives and no portion shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to the members.

ORGANISATION

The trustees are elected for a term of three years by the membership in accordance with the constitution.

FINANCIAL CONTROLS

Financial controls are carried out through the Trustees and an elected voluntary Management Committee.

INVESTMENT POWERS AND RESTRICTIONS

The trustees are authorised to invest surplus funds in high interest bank accounts. There are no restrictions as to where the funds may be invested, but policy has to be agreed by the Trustees and Management Committee.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The Guild has continued to carry out its primary objectives during the year under review. It is continuing to be difficult to find sources of funds.

It is the policy of the Trustees that funds that have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to 12 months' expenditure.

The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Guild's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

RESULTS

The results for the year, and the charity's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the attached financial statements.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of incoming and outgoing resources for the year then ended.

In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently, making judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent. The trustees must also prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the small companies regime under the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with Charities SORP (FRS 102).

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Gloucestershire Chinese Women's Guild

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2019, which are set out on pages 5 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 11.

Incoming resources

Grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.
