

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of members of St. Saviourgate

Unitarian Chapel held on 24th March 2019 in the Chapel

Present: 21 members were present:

Opening Words: Committee member Andrew Hill opened the meeting with a reading from : "One Day" by A S J Tessimond in *The Golden Thread: Words of Hope for a changing World* compiled and illustrated by Dorothy Boux.

As the Chairman, Nick Morrice, had lost his voice, Andrew Hill proposed that David Zucker be elected as Chairman, as he had been duly nominated and seconded, this was agreed and David Zucker took the chair and conducted the meeting.

1. Apologies were received from Claire Wilton and Laura Cox

2. Acceptance of the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 18th March 2018 was proposed by Adrienne Wilson and seconded by Jenny Jacobs, and accepted by the meeting.

3. Matters arising from the minutes:

9. Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) – The Charity commission approved our application to become "York Unitarians CIO" on 11th January 2019. There was a vote of thanks to the members of the CIO sub-committee (Nick Morrice, Sue Catts, Andrew Hill, Margaret Hill).

4. a. Annual Report 2018 : The Chairman's report was commended, and mention was made of Chapel members on General Assembly committees - Claire Wilton on Youth Panel, and Jenny Jacobs on the Penal and Social Affairs Panel. Acceptance of the Annual Report was proposed by Claire Lee and seconded by Sue Catts, and accepted by the meeting.

4.b. The Accounts for 2019 had not yet been independently examined. The Treasurer will send them to the Accountant for examination. A meeting of members will be called to approve the accounts when they are returned by the Examiner.

Matters arising from the accounts:-

a. Dee Boyle queried that the amount given for weddings for the last two years as an odd amount.

5. The Budget for 2019 had been circulated. This was calculated on the previous year's figures.

6. The Chapel Charity Accounts were in the Annual Report for information. Elizabeth Faiers is the treasurer. A standing order pays £500 per month into the Chapel congregational account. The investments are in CCLA COIF Ethical Investment funds.

a. Alan Pennington asked about the transfer of capital funds from the Chapel congregational account and the Chapel Charity accounts to the new CIO. This will happen when the new CIO bank account is set up.

b. The capital sum of the Chapel Charity investments will remain inviolate. In future its interest will be paid into the new CIO bank account.

c. There will be separate investment accounts in the new CIO for the Chapel congregational investments and the Chapel Charity investments.

d. When all Chapel Charity investments have been transferred to the CIO, the Chapel Charity will be closed down

All had been nominated and seconded. It was proposed by Alan Pennington, and seconded by Adrienne Wilson that they should be elected unopposed. This was accepted by the meeting.

The secretary, Margaret Hill, gave notice that this will be her final year as Secretary.

Thanks were expressed to Simon Hardy for being treasurer for about 20 years. We owe him an enormous debt of gratitude.

Thanks were also expressed to Claire Lee and Sue Catts who are standing down from the committee after many years.

8. Election of representatives to the Yorkshire Unitarian Union:

Jen Atkinson, Adrienne Wilson and Jenny Jacobs are willing to represent York Proposed by Sue Catts, and seconded by Dee Boyle and accepted by the meeting.

9. There was a discussion on the proposed G.A. motions

Motion 1 – Knife crime. Motion 2 – That Martin West should be made an Honorary Member of the General Assembly. Motion 3 – Findhorn Unitarian Network (FUN) has applied to become an Affiliated Society of the GA – and the Executive Committee considers it has met the criteria. The Assembly is asked to accept FUN as an affiliated society.

Claire Lee expressed surprise that there is no motion about climate change. The congregation will look into sending in a motion for next year's G.A. meetings in the autumn. The closing date for motions is 8 weeks before the first day of the meetings.

Stipend Review – The proposed increase to Ministers' stipends from 1st January 2020 is 3.5%, with no change to manse allowance. Pulpit supply - £50 remains the recommended minimum. It was agreed to vote in favour of this.

10. Any other relevant business :-

a. A worship studies course is proposed at Hull and Scarborough in May on Saturdays. This is part of the National Worship Studies course.

- b. Our fundraising day at St. Crux is on Saturday 11th May.
- c. Good wishes were expressed to Nick Morrice for a speedy recovery.

The meeting closed at 12.50 p.m.

Chair's Report 2020

Those of you with good memories will recall when writing last year's report that Nick Morrice, as outgoing Chairperson, likened himself to Doris Day. For context you will need to find you copy of his report. However, diversity remains a fundamental quality of what it is to be a Unitarian!

It should come as no surprise therefore that we are blessed with so many people able and willing to make different but significant contributions to all that we do. Forgive me if I pick just a few people out for special mention.

This year we said, "Good-bye" to Nicky Jenkins. Nicky had been our minister since September 2017. Her services were always well prepared, inspirational, and constructed to meet the mood of the moment. We are sorry to have lost her but wish her well in her retirement. At her retirement party, which was superbly organised, for which grateful thanks to all who made the event such a success, I expressed the view that she would continue to be welcome at our chapel. So, she is!

Until we find a replacement minister, I am very grateful to the many members of the congregation who have shown willing to lead us in worship. If anyone reading this has not already come forward, thinks that leading a service might be for them, please do not be shy. There are many members ready to provide support and guidance. I speak with experience of this.

I now turn to the vexed issue of funding. For many years Simon Hardy undertook the onerous task of being our treasurer. Last year, after so many years, he took the view that it was time for someone else to stand in his shoes. These were difficult shoes to fill but Nick Morrice generously stood down as Chairperson to take on the task. We are all very much in their debt, which given their roles is probably only appropriate. All donations to chapel funds are always welcome!

I now want to follow Nick Morrice's lead from last year and thank everyone more generally for their work.

Secretary's report

On 11th January 2019 the Charity Commission granted York Unitarians status as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation with the Charity number 1181531. Work has progressed during the year to put this into operation. A new bank account with Cafbank was opened in the name of York Unitarians CIO, and vesting documents organised by our solicitor were signed in December 2019. The AGM in 2019 was the last as St. Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel. The AGM in 2020 will be the first as York Unitarians CIO and elections for trustees will be held under the CIO Constitution dated 18th March 2018. Sue Catts stepped down from the CIO Sub-committee on moving to Australia, the Committee is grateful for all the work Sue has done. The other members of the sub-committee have continued to work through the processes of changing to a CIO.

The Chapel Committee met eight times during the year and brief reports of the meetings were published in the *York Unitarian*. During 2019 the Chapel was open for worship at 11 a.m. every Sunday, with services conducted by our minister, Rev. Nicky Jenkins, and by members and friends of the congregation. Services included a visit by the Unitarian General Assembly President 2018/19 Joan Cook, a member of the Edinburgh congregation in March, Laura Dobson of the Chorlton congregation, Chris Carr of the Hull congregation and Stephanie Bisby, a student for the Unitarian ministry. Members of the Scarborough congregation came to York for a service in September. The Clerkes of All Saints choir sang during one service. There were four Bright Lights services during the year. The Sparklers children's programme met monthly. The Meditation group met weekly. Four Death and Dying workshops led by Janet Eldred were held in the spring. A fundraising event for Chapel funds was held at the nearby St. Crux Hall in May. Laura Cox took over organising the Worship Leaders and musicians list from July from Margaret Hill.

In June our minister Nicky Jenkins informed the committee that she wished to retire at the end of the year. Members of the Ministry Sub-committee were appointed, Jen Atkinson, Claire Lee, Margaret Hill and Claire Wilton. The Sub-committee prepared a job description and an advertisement for a half-time minister which appears on the Ministerial Vacancy list of the General assembly. The Sub-committee will deal with applications, invite prospective candidates for 3 visits, make recommendations to the Committee, interview the candidate, and subsequently make a recommendation to the Congregation when a candidating service will be arranged.

A Membership service was held in October when John Brogdan, Keith Brown, Richard Brown, Susan Elliot and John Issett were welcomed into membership. Long time members Joan Rowland and John Grange died during the year and the minister conducted their funerals. At the end of 2019 there were 44 Chapel members for whom we made quota-payments to the Unitarian General Assembly. There were two weddings of Evangelos Ntanopoulos and David Jenkins and of Frances McDonnell and Lloyd Massingham. There was a naming ceremony for Teddy Robin, son of Amy and Eddie Shannon.

Chapel members attended various denominational activities including the Unitarian Music Society, Summer School, Unifest, and Junior weekend all held at the Unitarian conference centre at Great Hucklow. Jenny Jacobs and Elizabeth Faiers were the Chapel's delegates to the General Assembly meetings in Birmingham. Laura Cox attended under the newcomer bursary scheme. Nicky Jenkins, Margaret and Andrew Hill also attended. Various chapel members attend meetings of the York Interfaith Group.

The Chapel was used as a Polling Station for Elections twice in May and again in December, the committee is grateful to Simon Hardy and Joan Sinanan for overseeing the delivery and uplifting of polling equipment, and opening and locking up on the Election days.

The Chapel was open to the public for York Residents' Festival weekend in January 2019 with 110 visitors repeating an exhibition about Charles Darwin from 10 years before. A blue plaque commemorating Lady Sarah Hewley and her connection with the Chapel was placed on a house in St. Saviourgate in the approximate area of Lady Hewley's home. The Chapel has been used regularly for concerts during the year, including the regular Friday lunchtime concerts and the monthly Late Music concerts.

Outreach included a collection of tinned food for the charity "Carecent" which provides breakfast for the homeless at the nearby Methodist church. Retiring collections of money were made for the General Assembly, and the Send a Child to Hucklow Fund. Our local charity during 2019 was MySightYork (formerly the York Blind and partially sighted society), starting with Pink Elephant collection boxes, a U3A Concert in March, and a sponsored walk in the autumn. A cheque for £1200 was presented to a representative from MySightYork in December. The Chapel Committee has agreed to continue contributing to the finances of the Yorkshire Unitarian Union's paid administrator for a further year.

The Committee is grateful for the financial support given by the Chapel Charity, and by members and friends. The Committee is also grateful to the many people who took Sunday services; and to the musicians who played; to the members of the sub-committees; and to everyone who volunteered to do anything around the Chapel. The committee is also grateful to Melissa, our cleaner, for keeping the Chapel clean and tidy. **Margaret Hill, Secretary.**

Treasurer's Report for 2019

I have chosen to present the accounts more or less as the previous Treasurer presented them, although the actual 2018 accounts approved in June took the form of a Charity Commission template. Technically, the past year is made up of accounts for the financial year 1 January – 10 January for St Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel, and accounts for 11 January – 31 December for York Unitarians CIO. These are available to view on request as two separate CC templates; they have been combined for simplicity in the published accounts.

It has not been an easy year for myself or my assistant, Adrienne Wilson, getting on top of the Treasurer role. The role involves dealing with HMRC, the Charity Commission, banks, individuals, and computers by telephone, email, and post. It has required patience, perseverance, familiarisation and many hours of application. Hopefully the problems have peaked and the way ahead will be easier. We would like to offer heartfelt and considerable thanks to Gill Chippett, whose advice, help and support have been invaluable over the past year. She produced a tailor-made spreadsheet (which has now been simplified after a year of use). In due course we might manage to transfer details onto the new software, DataDev, which we purchased on the advice of Essex Hall nearly a year ago – but it is not totally straightforward.

Some comments on Income - Offertories have held up well. The apparent increase in donations (which includes coffee receipts, and donations at weddings and residents' weekends) is partly due to the inclusion of money donated to charities. Next year this category will include only monies kept for the chapel, and money donated for other charities (which comes in and goes out again) will be recorded under Fundraising. The increase in grant from the Chapel Charity enabled us to open the new bank account for York Unitarians CIO with CAF bank. The previous categorisation for concerts included lettings. So the apparent large increase in lettings income includes concert *rentals* previously considered concert *income*. We can be very grateful to Adrienne Wilson and David Hammond whose lunchtime concerts in 2019 raised over £1500 for virtually no expenditure.

The lack of Gift Aid reclaimed resulted from a misunderstanding about procedure. Once contact details had been changed, and relevant dates agreed with HMRC, a refund of £8385.29 was received which will feature in next year's accounts. The decision to abandon the use of Gift Aid envelopes has made my role much less time consuming, as donations up to £30 are eligible under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme and do not have to be linked to named individuals. Gift Aid is also claimed on amounts paid by Standing Order when those individuals are eligible for tax and have signed a Gift Aid declaration form. I extend my thanks and appreciation to those members and non-members who make a regular financial commitment which benefits the chapel even when they are unable to attend services.

Some comments on Expenditure - There has been almost no expenditure on Maintenance. Possibly we are storing up issues for the future here. It would be helpful if the Committee appointed a member who would take responsibility for liaising with Peter Exley concerning these issues, a role previously held by Jen Atkinson. The amount raised for our chosen charity, MySightYork, was very commendable. It included over £150 from the pink elephant collecting boxes. The GA quota payment represents a payment to Essex Hall of £35 per member for 42 members.

The apparent large surplus of income exceeding expenditure is a result of the Chapel Charity donation of $\pounds 10,000$ already referred to. The old CAF current account will be closed now that all SOs have been transferred to the new account.

Turning to our Assets, we can note an increase in value of £8741 as opposed to a loss of £3716 last year. These are ethical investments with COIF and seem to be doing well. It is questionable whether we still need a Skipton Building Society account, which pays a negligible rate of interest. The Committee is currently considering other options.

Treasurer's Report on St Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel Charity Accounts 2019

The Chapel Charity is a registered charity (no 230167) set up for the sole purpose of looking after the permanent endowment funds of St Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel, York. (the Chapel). 'Permanent Endowment' means that the capital cannot be spent without the permission of the Charity Commission. The purpose of the Chapel Charity is to invest the funds and apply the income 'for the advancement of the religious and other charitable work of St Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel, York.'

In practice this is achieved by passing the dividend income over to the congregation. The charity is established under a trust scheme of 1974. The endowments come from legacies left to the chapel in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries. Various gifts in later years have also been gratefully received.

The Annual Accounts for the year ending on 31st December 2019.

<u>Income</u>

The dividend income was £16,336.77; this was £313.61 more than in 2018. An anonymous donation of £500 was gratefully received. This has been invested as part of the permanent endowment as requested.

Expenditure

Grant payments of £19,000 were made to the chapel, some to the chapel charity account but the majority to the York Unitarian CIO account (York Unitarians are now a CIO). Other expenditure was £60 for bank charges.

Investments

I am pleased to report that this year there has been a very good increase in the value of our investments. On Dec 31st 2018 it had decreased to 218.83 pence per unit. On Dec 31st it had increased to 258.91pence per unit giving our holding plus the purchase of £500 of units a value of £527,244.06. The value of our holdings has therefor risen by £82,041.47.

The Budget for 2020

The value of our investment is still rising (as of 16/1/2020), but I have only predicted an income of £16,000 as I prefer to be on the low side. As St. Saviourgate Unitarian Chapel and its investments will soon be amalgamated, this charity no. 230167 will soon close and the Permanent Endowment whilst remaining as a separate designated fund will be looked after by the treasurer of the CIO Mr Nick Morrice. When this happens all the income will be automatically paid into the CIO current account.

COLTON'S HOSPITAL ALMSHOUSES TRUST

This trust was set up 303 years ago by a previous minister of St. Saviourgate; Thomas Colton and his wife. There are 12 cottages round a central lawn on Shipton Street off Burton Street Lane. Nicky Jenkins is the Chair Person of the Trust and Simon and Marta Hardy, Dee Boyle and Richard Thompson have all been trustees for a number of years and Joan Sinanan became a trustee in February 2020. The other two trustees live locally to the Almshouses and are associated with the neighbouring Anglican Church.

During 2019 we arranged to have the exterior woodwork of all the cottages repainted. It was

decided to give the residents a choice of three colours (blue, burgundy and green) for their front and shed doors. This has made the general appearance of the cottages much more attractive. At the same time we had the railings and gates also painted; they have remained black. Peter Exley has continued as our gardener and has planted more bulbs and wild flowers on the central lawn and we have even more rare Marsh Orchids growing on the lawn. This year we intend to replace all the central heating boilers in the cottages, this will be part of our cyclical maintenance.
