Governance and management

The charity is operated under the rules of its CIO - Foundation constitution adopted by the trustees on 18th May 2014 and registered with the Charity Commission on 8 August 2014.

The skills and experience required by the Trustee Board is regularly reviewed and, where gaps are identified, new trustees with the requisite skills and knowledge are actively sought.

All new trustees receive a personalised induction, which includes meetings with existing trustees. They receive copies of key documents and updates on their roles and responsibilities as required.

Objectives and activities

The prevention or relief of poverty in Uganda by providing: grants, items and services to individuals in need and/or charities, or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty.

Public benefit statement

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

EVC's main activity is child sponsorship. This is supplemented by a church appeals programme and a number of other one-off and recurring activities to fund improvements in the infrastructure at schools which the sponsored children attend.

In setting our programme each year we have regard to both the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and prevention and relief of poverty for the public benefit. The trustees always ensure that the programmes we undertake are in line with our charitable objects and aims.

Summary of the main achievements during the period

Child Sponsorship Programme

Just under 60 new children joined this programme during the year thereby benefitting from the life changing opportunity of education.

Church Appeals

This year we held 17 church appeals within England raising significant funds for our work. We continue to receive great support from the church communities. We are also working to diversify our funding streams in order not to be over reliant on one source of income.

Finance and Administration Manager and Assistant (based in Uganda)

These posts are funded through a donation from EVC Uganda to the employing body in that country and have contributed significantly to the high quality of our work, enabling us to meet both the needs of the children and their donors.

Projects

A major donor contributed the funding for a boys dormitory at one of our EVC schools, the building of which will commence in 2020. We have also agreed on building a much needed IT / Vocational Classroom and a 3 Storey Classroom block at our schools next year.

Father Boniface's UK visit

Father Boniface, one of EVC's founders, visited the UK this year and met with Trustees, volunteers and child sponsors to talk about the work in Uganda.

<u>Concert</u>

This year was another great success with the largest turnout to date providing a very enjoyable evening and raising significant funds for the Charity.

Trustees

Jenny Hall retired from the Board this year and we thank her for her contribution.

Financial review

The surplus for the year was £48,482 (2018:£335) which has been transferred to general reserves. In addition to the funds transferred to Uganda for child sponsorship, during the year an additional £6,477 was transferred principally by way of contribution to salaries and administrative costs in Uganda and to buy fire safety equipment. In summary £73,619 was sent to Uganda in the financial year.

During 2020 work will commence on a number of construction projects and as a result trustees have decided to designate the following amounts from unrestricted reserves - Boys dormitory £36,000; Vocational classroom block £33,000.

As of 31st December 2019, total reserves were £90,349 (2018:£41,867) which were represented by cash at bank. Bank includes restricted funds of £14,066.

The charity's policy on reserves

EVC needs reserves in order to properly plan for unforeseen significant financial expenditure. The annual financial planning and regular monitoring/review process enables the reserves to be maintained at the right level. The level of reserves is reviewed on an annual basis and in accordance with increases in income and expenditure. A cash flow analysis aids this process.

The board has set up a reserves policy that requires:

- Reserves be maintained at a level ensuring EVC's core activity could continue during a process of unforeseen financial difficulty;
- o Takes into account planned activity levels;
- o EVC's commitments.

The following headings were used in the development of the policy:

- o The current reserves policy statement, as above;
- o Risk assessment against each category of income and expenditure;
- o Future activity levels, likely requirements and levels;
- EVC's commitments;
- o Statement of the required reserves level as a result of the above.

Financial risks

The trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks the charity faces and confirms that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks.

As EVC is staffed entirely by volunteers and has not entered in to any long-term financial commitments, the level of financial risk to which the organisation is exposed is very low. All child sponsorship and development projects in Uganda are financed entirely by monies received from sponsors and donors.

Plans for future periods

EVC continues to operate very successfully with low costs and a sound financial base. The work continues to thrive and grow and we thank all our donors and supporters for their great support.

Corona virus

Corona virus has had a significant impact on our sponsored children's education in Uganda with schools closed from March until at least September 2020. Every effort is being made to provide outreach teaching to the children where they are living and the success of this is being monitored closely. Similarly, the virus will significantly impact upon our income streams during 2020, but it is anticipated this will return to normal from around the start of the second quarter of 2021. As income will be less, the ratio of costs to income will increase.

The specific purposes for which the funds are to be applied are as follows:

Child Sponsorship - Individuals pay to sponsor a child to attend private school in Uganda.

Lighting Project - funds raised by Risely Men's group for the purchase of solar powered lighting equipment for use in Uganda.

Xmas Cards - funds raised from the sale of Christmas Cards made by the Children in Uganda for the purchase of school equipment and materials.

Children - Sponsors contribute for any extra items the children may need.

Rosaries - funds raised from the sale of rosaries made by the children in Uganda for the purchase of school equipment and materials.

Medical - towards medical costs for the Children.

Granny - donated for the Grandmother of a sponsored child.

Charity Set up - towards the Charity set up costs.

Vocational classroom block – to be used to construct a vocational classroom block at St Matia Mulumba school.

St. MM Boys Dorm – to be used to construct a boys dormitory at St Matia Mulumba school.

3. Trustees' remuneration

During this period, a total of £1,187 was reimbursed to 2 trustees for travel & accommodation expenses incurred.

4. Related party transactions

There were no related party transactions in this period.

5. Glossary of terms

Creditors: These are amounts owed by the charity, but not paid during the accounting period.

Debtors: These are amounts owed to the charity, but not received in the accounting period.

Restricted funds: These are funds given to the charity, subject to specific restrictions set by the donor, but still within the general objects of the charity.
