The Women's Council is a voluntary, non-political, non-sectarian organisation with over 75 years' history of friendship, understanding and cooperation between women of Asian Countries and the United Kingdom.

The Council's aims are to advance the education of women in the UK concerning the peoples of Asia, Asia Pacific and The Middle East and also to assist in the relief of need and sickness in these countries. For over forty years the charity has been promoting the training of women working in child welfare in Asia and is now focused on improving the care of and promoting inclusion for children with disabilities and their families in their communities in Asia.

The Council is supported primarily by Patrons, Heads of Mission where they are women or wives of Heads of Missions to The Court of St. James from 26 countries in Asia, Asia Pacific, and by Members and Friends. The work is undertaken by a team of volunteer Committee Members who attend regular Committee Meetings. Financial responsibility is exercised by the Board of Trustees. Activities of the Council include talks, coffee mornings and other cross- cultural activities designed to promote friendship between women of UK and the countries of Asia, while supporting the training programme.

Membership of The Women's Council is open to any woman in the UK or Overseas who is interested in the Council's aims. Like-minded women's organisations or women's sections of mixed organisations may become Corporate Members. The Council is always interested to hear from potential new members.

TRUSTEES REPORT FOR 2018

Innovations to our fundraising programme included a very pleasant garden party at the Royal Overseas League and a splendid Christmas Luncheon at The RAG. A memorable Japanese Cherry Blossom Celebration arranged by a member and a splendid coffee morning hosted by a friend of TWC were among a number of personal initiatives which gave members much pleasure as well as generous support to our training and scholarship funds. Our programme of cultural events continued with a series of interesting visits which helped to meet our aim of offering friendship to women of Asia while at the same time, contributing modestly to our funds. However the financial success of the year was Piaras Moore's magnificent achievement of walking the Wild West Coast of Ireland, thereby raising the splendid sum of £10,514 for our CII Course. Finally, in the autumn a new format Consortium of our ever generous Diplomatic Patrons led to some splendid offers of fundraising events in aid of our Training and Scholarship programme in 2019.

The prime focus of all our endeavours continued to be the support of our regional training programme for leaders, planners, trainers and practitioners - particularly women working in the field of Disability in the Community in the countries of Asia, Asia Pacific In January 2018, the very successful annual Community and the Middle East. Initiatives in Inclusion Course, organised in English medium by our partner ADAPT, was attended by participants from Bangladesh, Bhutan, The Maldives, Mongolia, Nepal, Tajikistan, as well as from India - Mumbai, Nagaland, Sikkim and The Tibetan Community in Exile. Following earlier experience whereby ADAPT had provided trainers to a country where there was a net work of CII alumnae who organized local training and provided translation and interpretation, a number of in country "hubs" have been established with a view to developing a system of such second level training. the autumn, recruiting for the 2019 Course got underway with interest shown by organizations in nine countries including South Korea and Tonga. We are also delighted to report that, after a gap of seven years due to insecurity in the Middle East, our other partner SETI, with the help of some essential "seedcorn" funding from The Women's Council, took the courageous step of organizing in Jordan its 7th Community Based Rehabilitation Training in Arabic, with participation from Gaza, Iraq, Jordan, Morocco, Palestine, Sudan and Yemen. In the event, this long awaited oversubscribed and well funded by participating organisations, so that the bulk of TWC's committed funding is being held over for a second course in 2019.

Training is one of the most economical and effective ways of bringing about change and development and we feel exceptionally privileged to be working in consultation and cooperation with two such remarkable partners as ADAPT and SETI, who are leaders in promoting rehabilitation and inclusion for children with disabilities. We thank them, our President, Diplomatic Patrons, Honorary Training Adviser, Committee, Members and friends for all their help in so many ways and look to them for continued support in our aim of helping to improve the lives and opportunities of many more hundreds of children with disabilities, who are officially recognised to be one of the most disadvantaged categories of children worldwide.

THE WOMEN'S COUNCIL (REGISTERED CHARITY NO. 266145) NOTES TO THE STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 2018

1. Basis of Preparation.

These Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost (except that investments are shown at market value) in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011. They aim to comply with current statutory requirements and with the Constitution of the Women's Council.

2. Accounting Policies

- a) Incoming Resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are virtually certain that they will receive the resources, and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.
- b) Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with Events and Fundraising Activities) the income resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the Statement of Financial Activities.
- c) Expenditure is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.
- d) Fixed Asset Investments are valued at stock exchange mid-market values at the year end.

3. Assets of the Council.

These are divided into five funds:

- a) The General Fund supports the general activities of the Council.
- b) The **Training and Scholarship Fund** supports the main charitable activity of the Council. The programme focuses on Community Based Rehabilitation and Inclusion for disabled children, and supports women working in this field in Asia to benefit from regional training.
- c) In 1977 the late Mrs. Marcus Smith bequeathed investments then valued at £27,651, the income from which assists in supporting the scholarship programme.
- d) In 1978 a Travelling Scholarship Fund was established in memory of the late **Lady Ruth Egerton**. The interest is now used to help fund scholars' fares to attend the regional courses supported by the Council.
- e) In 1993 a fund was established in memory of the late Mrs. Jenny Thompson, the income is now used for the health, welfare and cultural enrichment of the scholars while on the Courses.

4. Investments of the Council.

The Training and Scholarship Fund has 23,100.96 COIF Charities Fixed Interest Income Units, The Marcus Smith Bequest has 24,489.796 M & G Investments Charibond Income Shares, The Ruth Egerton Fund has 9063.00 M & G Investments Charibond Income Shares and 17,965.34 COIF Charities Global Equity Income Fund Income Units and The Jenny Thompson Fund 1,279.65 COIF Charities Investment Fund Income Units.

5. Fund Income

Training and Scholarship Fund. This includes £10,514 earmarked donations for places on CII courses.

6. <u>Direct Charitable Expenditure.</u>

The expenditure of £30,864 from the Training and Scholarship Fund was £27,577 towards the cost of the 2018 ADAPT CII Course, plus assistance towards the residential costs and contributions towards the fares of eligible women participants, together with the ongoing evaluation and development of the CII training programme and £3,287 initial payment towards the cost of the November 2018 SETI CBR regional training course.

7. Committed Liabilities.

The Trustees have committed £30,000 for the 2019 CII Course and £16,713 balance of commitment not spent to the SETI CBR regional training course, totalling £46,713 (commitments for 2018 were £40,000).

8. Reserve Policy.

This is to ensure TWC's continued operation and essentially its regional training programme for a minimum of three years, while it is recognised to be playing a key role in the improvement of care and promotion of Inclusion for children with disabilities in the region of operation.
