The objectives of the society are to:

- 1. To promote research into the processes, causes and effects of ageing and, as indicated, into means for counteracting these, both in human beings and in other organisms;
- 2. To publish the results of all such useful research;
- 3. To further public education therein.

In accordance with the constitution of the society, the charity undertook the following activities between the 1<sup>st</sup> Dec. 2018 and the 30<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2019.

Promotion of research was undertaken by the continuance of a PhD studentship (valued at up to £69,750 over three years). The student started their project in October 2016.

Diffusion of information on ageing research via: the charity website <a href="https://www.bsra.org">www.bsra.org</a>, links with the society of biology and the annual scientific meeting.

Promotion of the awareness of ageing research via engagement with the public bodies and other charities. The society continued to promote UK based ageing research in the USA via the annual award of a bursary to fund attendance of an early career research at the American Aging Association meeting.

Dissemination of the latest developments in ageing research via the annual scientific meeting (held in Newcastle in 2019).

New trustees are expected to read the guidance on public benefit issued by the charity commission, on appointment.
