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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

Advisors - Spiritualist National Union - Redwoods, Stansted Hall, Stansted, Mountfitchet, Essex, CM24, 8UD.

Trustees are normally appointed by the Annual General Meeting of Centre members (or co-opted by the committee of Trustees if appropriate). All in accordance with SNU Rules and Guidance, for the management of the Centre and its assets and also in accordance with legislation relating to Health and Safety, Electrical Regulations and other statutory requirements. New Trustees are made aware of their responsibilities on a "one to one" training basis.

Reading National Spiritualist Centre has been under the supervision of the West London District Council since 18th December 2017. The Trustees are overseen by Lorraine and Ernie Gilbert-Gray from WLDC.

At the Annual General Meeting in April 2019, a motion was proposed and passed that the Church would be renames as a Centre. Many SNU Churches are making this change in order to better reflect their place in the local community and to attract a younger element.

Reading National Spiritualist Centre provides religious services for public worship, including the dissemination of Spiritualist teachings and philosophy, together with special services through the year, along with events and functions. It also facilitates events supporting relevant charities where the event is clearly defined as supporting the said charity and not the Centre funds.

Reading National Spiritualist Centre is associated to the Spiritualist National Union. The provision of Spiritual Healing is provided by fully trained approved healers or trainee healers, under the supervision of a full healer (under the accreditation scheme of the Spiritualist National Union).

Reading National Spiritualist Centre has a safety plan covering all aspects of its activities and the building undertaking risk management as required.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objective of Reading National Spiritualist Centre is to provide religious services for public worship, including the dissemination of Spiritualist teachings and philosophy, together with services throughout the year, along with functions and events.

Significant activities

The main activities are public worship services on Thursdays and Sundays, Spiritual Healing Clinics on Mondays and Wednesdays and awareness courses as needed for interested parties. Public workshops on philosophy and the development of spiritual gifts are held on a regular basis.

Therefore, the Charity continues to provide well attended services with guest speakers, a high level of training and awareness opportunities. The Centre has also supported local charities, the Diana Brindlecombe Animal Rescue Centre and the Berkshire Women's AId in 2019.

Public benefit

When planning our activities for the year, the Trustees of the Centre have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. To facilitate this work, it is important that the fabric of the Centre is maintained.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The Charity's principal sources of income are collections at services, donations, monthly coffee mornings, workshops, events and rental income from the flat.

During 2019, there have been numerous upgrades to the interior and security of the building and also some expenditure on items to enhance future activities at the Centre, including new CCTV and gazebos.

Financial reserves are mainly held in government bonds and interest paying accounts with the SNU Trust. Working funds are held in accounts held at Lloyds Bank.

The SNU Trust has an ethical investment policy and risk investment is not undertaken.

There are no funds in deficit.

Reserves policy

The Charity's policy on reserves is to ensure that the Centre activities are maintained and the reserves are available to fund any major building works and maintenance. There is a current concern over the state of the Hall roof.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Risk management

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
