#### Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2019

### Reference and Administrative Details of the Charity, its Trustees and Advisers

The Trustees of the charity known as St Andrew's Roundhay United Reformed Church Charity (St Andrew's Roundhay URC), Shaftesbury Avenue, Leeds, West Yorkshire, LS8 1DS herewith present their report on the work of the charity and its accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019.

St Andrew's Roundhay URC was an excepted charity but was required to register by the Charities Act 2006. The church registered as St Andrew's Roundhay United Reformed Church Charity, registered charity number 1129283, on 23 April 2009.

#### Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is governed through the Trustees' and the Church Meetings as detailed in the Church Rules. Many management decisions are taken by the Trustees' Meetings with formal ratification of these decisions at Church meeting. These Rules give no overriding management responsibility for decisions to one person, as all decisions are approved by consensus or majority at properly constituted meetings.

The Trustees are the serving Minister and current serving Elders of the Church. Elders, other than the Church Secretary and Treasurer, are nominated and elected by the members in accordance with the Church Rules to serve a three year term, retiring in rotation. Elders can be co-opted in accordance with the Church Rules to fill a vacancy. All the current serving Elders have been elected. The Church Secretary and Church Treasurer are nominated by the Elders from amongst their number and elected annually by the members to serve a twelve month term. The Minister is called by the members in Special Church Meeting and inducted in accordance with the practice of The United Reformed Church. The Trustees normally meet formally eleven times a year at the monthly Elders' Meeting.

The Yorkshire Congregational Union Inc. acted as custodian trustee for the church throughout the year and holds title to the church's property assets on its behalf subject to trusts set out in the schedules to the United Reformed Church Act 1972.

#### Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2019

#### Aims of the charity

The object of the Charity is the advancement of the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in accordance with the Scheme of Union of the United Reformed Church.

St Andrew's mission statement is — The people of St Andrew's seek to tell and explore the stories of Jesus Christ and celebrate and share the love of God.

The main activities undertaken in the year to further the Charity's purposes for the public benefit include:

- the provision of public worship
- pastoral care and support for church members and those in the Roundhay community
- baptisms, weddings and funerals
- a venue for meetings of youth and community organisations

The Charity's trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

#### Objectives, activities, achievements and performance

The Charity seeks to be a welcoming place and a place of nurture and support for the members and adherents of our congregation, particularly in times of pastoral need.

The Charity seeks to be a welcoming place and provider of enabling facilities for many youth groups, uniformed and non-uniformed, and all age community groups, including common interest groups such as the Bridge Clubs, the Drama groups and WEA. Specifically we seek to encourage new visitors to our premises and new participants in our services from the local community. Please see fuller detail in our publication, "St Andrew's Life".

During 2019 formal membership was 159 (160 in 2018). 2 weddings were conducted at St Andrew's during the year and there was 1 infant baptism, 0 believer's baptisms and 0 infant blessings/thanksgivings/dedications. There were 4 funerals.

In addition, some 700 to 800 members of the local community visit our premises each week in connection with the various clubs for all ages, functions and activities held there.

Throughout the year, Mrs Beverley Gilbert was employed as part time Children and Families Worker, and Mrs Anne Jones was employed as part time Church Administrator. Mr Ryan Lawrence joined as as a Time for God volunteer in August 2019.

In February St Andrew's hosted homeless asylum seekers for a week as part of the WYDAN scheme, providing meals, hospitality and sleeping accommodation in the sanctuary. Further work on our vision strategy was done at a second Vision Day which was addressed by guest speaker Rev Peter Ball. In August 2019, St Andrew's participated in a Partnership visit to Bernburg and Berlin with our Partner churches of the Lutherkirche, Frankenthal and the Martinskirche, Bernburg.

The Festivals Group played a major role in Harvest celebrations and Advent preparation when every group that meets on church premises was invited to make an advent wreath, which were then displayed throughout the building. This outreach generated much enthusiasm and a total of 74 wreaths. The issue of climate change, with all its implications, has been high on our agenda and consideration of how we may make our buildings and practices more environmentally friendly is part of an on-going debate.

### Statement of trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- · Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- · Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- · Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the activities of the charity will continue.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011 and Statements of Recommended Accounting Practice . They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### **Financial Review**

#### Expenditure

There was expenditure of £14,900 in the year to refurbish the church's kitchen and spending on fabric was greater than in 2018, which contributed to an increase in spending over the previous year. Contributions to the URC Ministry and Mission Fund and to the Yorkshire Synod were broadly stable. The church continued to employ a part time administrator, Anne Jones, although she resigned in December. The Elders continued to discuss potential redevlopments of the church premises and there was expenditure on professional fees as a result. The church continued to employ a part time Youth and Childfren's worker and also met the costs of a Time for God voluntary worker. The Finance Team began work to align the formrely separate accounting for youth and children work with the General Fund

#### **Plans for Future Periods**

Church Secretary

We have a long tradition of welcoming those from the local community to share our premises and activities, regardless of whether or not they attend church on a Sunday morning and whatever their ethnicity, background or religion. We welcome all of whatever faith or none.

Our aim is to be a successful centre in our community: to be a beacon of light in our neighbourhood and a place of welcome where many people and groups will want to meet and use the resources we have available. We wish to attract people of all ages through creating an open, welcoming vibrant space accessible to all, both able-bodied and those with additional needs such as dementia sufferers and their carers. We want everyone to feel that St Andrew's is a place where they feel welcomed and valued. We want to build on the opportunities we have already identified in our role as a community church and to enhance and improve the space we have available to do this.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1a Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2015) issued by the Charity Commission, and the United Reformed Church guidance. The accruals basis of accounting has been adopted for the current year, and the principal accounting policies set out below are applied consistently.

#### 1b Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the church in furtherance of its charitable objectives. Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor, or contained in the terms of a grant. Endowment funds are funds the capital of which must be maintained; normally only income arising from investment of the endowment may be used, either as restricted or unrestricted funds depending on the purpose and terms on which the endowment was established. The church currently has no endowment funds.

#### 1c Incoming Resources

Recognition of incoming resources: These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Grants and donations: Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts: Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SoFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

#### 1d Resources Expended and Liabilities

Resources Expended: Resources expended are recognised in the period to which they relate and include attributable VAT

Liability recognition: Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

#### 1e Tangible Fixed Assets

Freehold property: Freehold properties are held at best estimates of market value as set out in note 13.

**Equipment:** Equipment is held at cost less depreciation.

#### 1f Taxation

As part of the United Reformed Church, the church was an excepted charity within the meaning of the Taxes Acts for the period covered by these accounts. From 23 April 2009 the church was a registered charity. Accordingly it is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income and capital gains received to the extent that such income or gains are applied to exclusively charitable purposes. No provision for taxation has been made in these financial statements.

The following church organisations coming under the authority of Elders' and Church Meetings hold cash or bank accounts 1g Church Organisations which have not been consolidated into these financial statements, except to the extent of funds remitted to the Treasurer and recorded as donations from church organisations.

The accounts of these organisations have not been examined by the Church Treasurer.

### 7 TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

The Act requires the disclosure of remuneration paid to any trustee of the charity. The only trustee to receive any remuneration was Revd.Tim Lowe. Remuneration was paid as follows: Stipend £26,064 (£25,572: 2018 ) - paid centrally by the United Reformed Church; one-off child allowance - £2,536; Pension contributions £5,900 (£3,910: 2018) - paid centrally by the United Reformed Church; Car allowance £1,200 (£1,200:2018) - funded by St Andrews. In addition housing and associated costs were provided. The minister also received fees in connection with some weddings and funerals. One of the two Authorised persons who act as Registrars for weddings is an Elder, to whom fees are passed on by the church from couples married in church.

Elders receive no expenses for attendance at meetings, but may be reimbursed for goods or services purchased on behalf of the Church.

It was not considered necessary to update the valuation at 31 December 2019. Title to the church's property assets is held by The Yorkshire Congregational Union Inc, subject to trusts set out in the

schedules to the United Reformed Church Act 1972.

The church was valued by Walker Singleton, Chartered Surveyors in 2004 as a wholly ecclesiatical premises. In view of the fact that no change of use is anticipated in the foreseeable future, the Trustees do not consider that the expense of updating the 2004 valuation is justified.
