Structure, governance and management

The charity was formed by Trust Deed on 30 December 2002 as amended by Supplementary Trust Deeds on 30 April 2003 and 19 December 2016. New trustees are appointed by the existing trustees. (Previously, trustees were appointed by virtue of their respective office at St Andrew the Great Church or by the Finance & Standing Committee on behalf of the PCC of St Andrew the Great Church).

The charity's name was changed from St Andrew the Great Ministry Support Trust to Gospel Ministry Support Trust on 19 December 2016.

The Charities Act 2011 requires the trustees to ensure that the charity keeps accounting records of all the charity's transactions so as to disclose at any time, with reasonable accuracy, the financial position of the charity at that time and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the disclosure regulations. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of error, fraud and other irregularities.

The Trustees can see no major risks associated with their operation.

Trustees meet a minimum of twice yearly and maintain regular contact with each other.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the Trust are the advancement of the Christian Gospel in the Diocese of Ely and elsewhere and in particular (but not exclusively):

- (a) to provide support to individuals engaged in full time and part time paid or unpaid voluntary Christian service
- (b) to facilitate training and education opportunities particularly for young adults considering Christian ministry as a vocation.

Public benefit

The Trustees of the Gospel Ministry Support Trust have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. In particular, the Trustees will apply the capital and income of the Trust Fund for the advancement of the Christian gospel in the Diocese of Ely and elsewhere through the provision of funds to support:

- (a) the provision of support for individuals engaged in Christian service
- (b) training and education opportunities particularly for young adults considering Christian ministry as a vocation.

Policy on grant making

The Trust only makes grants to church workers.

Achievements and performance

In 2019, the Trust continued to support the gospel ministry at Terrington St Clement by employing and paying the living and training expenses of an Associate Minister in the parish. In addition grants were made to Pastoral Workers at St Philemon's Church, Liverpool.

Financial review

The Trust employs people on a continuous contract. Funds to cover their employment are provided by other Christian charities and by personal donations. Therefore there is no requirement to hold significant reserves.

Plans for future periods

The Trust will continue to employ and pay the living and training expenses of the Associate Minister at Terrington St Clement. The Trust will also continue to make grants to Pastoral Workers at St Philemon's Church, Liverpool.

Reserves policy

As the Trust does not hold significant reserves, there is no need for a formal policy for investment at the present.

GOSPEL MINISTRY SUPPORT TRUST NOTES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1 Principal accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements of the charity have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated, and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) (issued July 2014) and with the Charities Act 2011.

Income

All income is accounted for gross when received and is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the Trust becomes entitled to the income, it is more likely than not that it will receive the income, and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation unless the donor or the terms of the appeal have specified otherwise.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

2 Trustees' remuneration and expenses

The Trustees received no remuneration during the year (2018 - nil). The Trust reimbursed expenses of £673 (2018 - £1,287) from the Staff Support Fund to R Slipper, a Trustee, for travel and conference fees, in his capacity as Vicar of Terrington St Clement. No other trustees (2018 - none) received any reimbursement of expenses.

3 Staff Support Fund, Terrington

During 2018, the Trust received an anonymous donation of £12,500 towards the support of staff of Terrington St Clement Church for expenses in attending conferences and similar activities. In addition the donor stipulated that the monies could also be used for administrative support of the Vicar of Terrington St Clement. The Trustees set up a Restricted Fund for this donation and payments are authorised by any two of the signatories of the Trust. Grants totalling £808 were made from the fund during 2019 (2018 - £1,569).

4 Wages and salaries

Salary costs are as shown on the statement of financial activities. The Trust has one employee (2018 - one) and makes pension contributions to a defined contribution pension scheme that is independently administered. At the year end, there was no outstanding pension contributions (2018 - £160 was outstanding).

5 Grants payable

During the year no grants were made to organisations (2018 - none) and a total of £12,808 (2018 - £10,569) was granted to 5 (2018 - 4) individuals.

6 Transfer

The transfer between funds was to ensure that the unrestricted fund did not continue in deficit.
