The PCC is a corporate body established by the Church of England. The PCC operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure (1956) and was registered with the Charity Commission on 19 August 2013, number 1153456.

The PCC meets on a regular basis to review activities and make plans to achieve its objectives of mission. In addition, there are informal meetings of officers to ensure progress is made.

Mission Statement:

- We exist to reveal Christ through worship and loving service.
- Our churches offer Christian hospitality, care and hope.
- St Helen's and St Martin's are, for everyone, sacred places where worship to God is offered.
- St Helen's is committed to contributing to the life of the city.
- St Martin's promotes peace and reconciliation.

Our vision is that we are led forward and motivated spiritually, prayerfully, joyfully and enthusiastically to show that we are a living church portraying and offering Christian love and values to the community around us and to those who suffer in the wider world.

At 31 December 2019 there were 46 on the Church Electoral Roll.

In 2013 St Helen's Church embarked on a project to re-establish St Helen's as a worshipping community in the City Centre. Throughout 2019 a weekly Eucharist with hymns and music has been held on Saturdays and the weekly Taizé service has continued on Wednesdays. There has also been a steady number of concerts and other arts events, hosted in the main by the churchwardens.

St Martin, Coney Street is a chapel of ease dedicated to Peace and Reconciliation. It is a partner in the Community of the Cross of Nails, holds regular services including prayers for healing and Friday prayers for peace and reconciliation.

We engage with those who attend concerts and events to encourage them to worship with us. We are exploring ways to seek to view those who attend as pilgrims, rather than visitors and tourists.

We continue to be grateful to the churchwardens for their invaluable work in both churches.

A freewill contribution of £3,000 (£1,500 in 2018) was paid to the Diocesan Common Fund.

The repairs to the fabric of our historic churches are in the main paid for by the Feoffees. We are grateful for the work of the Feoffees who review the quinquennial inspection report and provide the necessary funds.

Anonymous donations received during 2017 and 2018 were used to fund the provision of a sound system and hearing loop in St Helen and a hearing loop in St Martin. These were installed in April 2019.

The PCC adopted the Safeguarding Policy of York Diocese and has a named Parish Safeguarding Representative. In 2019 there were no regulated activities for children and vulnerable adults organised by the PCC. The PCC has complied with section 5 Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to the House of Bishops' guidance relating to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults).

The Churchwardens monitor the issue of advice by the Charity Commission and report to the PCC as necessary to ensure compliance with requirements. In 2019 there have been no party related transactions nor any matters that needed to be reported to the Commission.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006, using the receipts and payments basis.

Funds

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. Restricted funds represent income which is to be expended on the restricted purposes intended by the donor or for a specific PCC activity intended by the donor.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from accounts by s.10 (2) of the Charities Act 2011. No value is placed on movable church furnishings held by the churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal since the PCC considers this to be inalienable property. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or benefice buildings and movable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off as expenditure.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF THE ECCLESIASTICAL PARISH OF ST HELEN WITH ST MARTIN, YORK

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Helen with St Martin, York ("the PCC") for the year ended 31 December 2019.

This report is made solely to the PCC's trustees, as a body, in accordance with section 154 of the Charities Act 2011. My independent examination work has been undertaken so that I might state to the PCC's trustees those matters I am required to state to them in an Independent Examiner's Report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the PCC and the PCC's trustees as a body, for my independent examination work, for this report, or for the opinions I have formed.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity trustees of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act') and the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 ('the regulations').

I report in respect of my examination of the PCC's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act. My examination was also carried out in accordance with the terms found in the Church guidance, 2006 edition, issue by the Finance Division of the Archbishops' Council.

Independent examiner's statement

I have completed my examination. I confirm that no material matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:
