The Friends of Lichfield Cathedral Annual Report for the year ending 31 December 2019

Governance

The Friends of Lichfield Cathedral, founded in 1937, is governed by a Constitution approved on 21 May 2011 and is constituted as an unincorporated association.

Trustees

The trustees who served during the year are set out on page 1. The chairman is an ex-officio officer and trustee. The four officers of vice chairman, secretary, treasurer and events secretary are elected annually by the membership and are trustees. Two trustees are appointed by the Chapter of Lichfield Cathedral. Nine trustees are elected by the membership for periods of three years and retire in rotation. No elected trustee may serve more than two terms of three years in one position. In addition, the Executive Council may appoint up to two trustees to represent the wider interests of the diocese.

Objects

- To further the religious and other charitable work of Lichfield Cathedral.
- To assist and promote the restoration, maintenance, repair and improvement of the Cathedral and to support the worship, music and ministry of the Cathedral.

Aims

- To draw into fellowship the people of the Diocese and others with an interest in Lichfield Cathedral.
- To work with the Chapter in furthering the religious and charitable work of the Cathedral.
- To assist the work of repairing and preserving the fabric of the Cathedral and its precincts, its furnishings and vestments and to enhance it with special gifts.
- To support the worship and music of the Cathedral.
- To arouse, stimulate and maintain parish and public interest in the Cathedral.
- To provide a means whereby people who have at heart the wellbeing, mission and purpose of the Cathedral can keep in touch with its life and work.
- To raise and invest money to further the objects of the Friends.
- To organise social events and opportunities of fellowship, and to support such other charitable purposes relating to Lichfield Cathedral as the Executive Council in its absolute discretion shall see fit.

Review of Activities and Achievements

In 2019, the Friends have supported the religious and other charitable work of the Cathedral through various visits and fundraising events. Our visits have been to Southwell Minster in April, and Bletchley Park in November. The latter visit was attended by over 80 members. Other events for Friends included the Candlemas Supper, a wine tasting evening at local wine merchants Worth Brothers, a summer Hog Roast, and an evening to view our Artist-in-residence, Peter Walker's 'The Great Exhibition' inside the Cathedral. The AGM in June gave Friends who visit the Cathedral less regularly the opportunity to have in depth guided tours. The Christmas Tree Festival in December was again a major fundraiser for the Friends. To further our aims, we have continued to support the Artist-in-residence project and have provided a significant grant towards a new statue of St Chad.

Financial Review

i) Year End Results

The accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019 are enclosed. Net assets total £164,192, a decrease of £5,579 from £169,771 in the previous year.

Income was generated from donations, fund raising events, social activities and gift aid tax refunds. Income fell by £8,584 to £43,213, the main reason being that no legacies were received. Donations decreased over the previous year by £1,019 to £17,856 whilst the surplus from social events increased by £1,114 to £2,504. The 2019 Christmas Tree Festival generated a surplus in excess of £16,600.

Expenditure fell by £15,462 including a reduction of £12,985 in grants made and a saving of £2,508 in annual report printing costs.

The value of investments increased by £12,192.

The overall surplus and utilising reserves where necessary, was distributed in grants after applications were received for consideration. Grants totalling £51,015 were made and details are shown in the accounts.

ii) Financial Reserves Policy

Cash reserves are held in a Lloyds Bank current account for everyday purposes and a Church of England Deposit Fund account. Other investments comprise two Church of England Unit Trust Funds, designed specifically for the charity sector to generate both income and capital growth. The investments can be readily liquidated should the need for cash arise. The trustees regularly monitor interest rates and investment performance.

Net assets are unrestricted, and the funds can be freely used by the trustees. The trustees review the total reserves at each of their quarterly executive council meetings. They have estimated that a reserve of £20,000 is required to maintain the efficient running of the charity and to provide the required level of services to donors for a period of one year. Further reserves are required from time to time to meet the commitments made to the Dean and Chapter and furthermore as a contingency should unforeseen circumstances arise. The trustees consider that the net assets at 31 December 2019 meet these criteria.

iii) Financial Controls Policy

The trustees have put a Financial Controls Policy in place as recommended by the Charity Commission in guidance note CC8. This is to ensure that assets are properly used, funds are spent effectively, and financial affairs are well managed. The policy is reviewed annually.

Risk Review

The trustees have examined the major internal and external risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to minimise these risks.

Public Benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and have complied with their duties under the Charities Act 2011.

1. Accounting Policies
