Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Samaritans of Bury St. Edmunds and West Suffolk

I report on the financial statements of Samaritans of Bury St. Edmunds and West Suffolk for the year ended 31st March 2020 which are set out on pages 1 to 7 of the appendix to the Annual Report.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993) (the Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting by Charities, issued in March 2015 ('The Charities SORP 2015').

b) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income, there is reasonable certainty of receipt and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies apply to categories of income:-

- * Donations/Collections these are accounted for when received.
- * Legacies entitlement is the earlier of the charity receiving the final estate accounts or the legacy being received. No value is included where the legacy is subject to a life interest held by another party.
- * Donated Goods/Services this is included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified.
- * Grants where these are related to performance and specific deliverables, they are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance. Where income is received in advance, its recognition is deferred and included in creditors. Where entitlement occurs before income is received, the income is accrued. Capital grants are accounted for as income in the SOFA as soon as they are received.

c) Resources Expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resource. The following specific policies apply to categories of expenditure:-

- * Fundraising Costs are those costs incurred in seeking voluntary contributions.
- * Governance Costs are the costs associated with the governance arrangements of the charity, which relate to the general running of the charity as opposed to those costs associated with fundraising or charitable activities. Included within this category are costs associated with the strategic as opposed to the day to day management of the charity's activities.
- * Support Costs comprise the costs of activities such as the management, financial, administrative and IT, together with common services, office accommodation and communication costs. These are allocated across the categories of charitable expenditure, governance costs and costs of generating funds.

Depreciation - is provided on a straight line basis so as to write off the cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:-

d) Fund Accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds that are available for use, at the discretion of the trustees, in furtherance of the objectives of the charity and have not been designated for other purposes. Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. Restricted funds are funds that are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or that have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. Costs relating to such funds are charged against specific funds. The aim and use of each fund is set out in Note 3.

e) Taxation

Samaritans of Bury St Edmunds and West Suffolk is a registered charity and is therefore potentially exempt from taxation of its income and gains to the extent that they fall within part 10 of the Income Tax Act 2007 and section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992. No tax charge has arisen in the year.
