#### History, objectives and activities of the Charity

The Charity was formed in 2009 and registered with the Charity Commission for the sole purpose of delivering an innovative, replicable 'blueprint' project in the Brazilian Amazon that creates a sustainable business model for a local population enabling the community to continue to act as guardians of the rainforest

#### Achievement and Performance of the Charity

This year we have launched the project IPANEMA – Indigenous Production of robotic Aircraft using Natural and Environmental-friendly Materials from the Amazon region – in collaboration with the University of Southampton (UK) and the Federal University of Amazonas – UFAM (BR).

The IPANEMA project has been designed to respond to the demands of the communities of the Jauaperi and improve fire detection in the area as well as transportation of small materials such as medicine.

In June/July we have undertaken a reconnaissance trip in the Jauaperi region with a group of English, Brazilian students and professors prior to the start of the drone development in the respective universities. The participation of UFAM in this project is a great achievement and we hope the beginning of a long-standing partnership with a key university in the Amazon region.

#### Financial Review, investment policy and reserves

During the period the Charity made an overall profit on its ordinary activities of £4,577.

#### Future plans

The trustees intend for the Charity to continue to meet the requirements as per its mission statement.

#### Statement of trustees' responsibilities
