British Society of Cardiovascular Imaging/British Society of Cardiovascular CT Trustee BSCI/BSCCT Trustee Annual Report 2019-20

The objectives of the society are to:

- Promote the highest standards of practice of cardiac imaging in the British Isles
- Promote education, training and the dissemination of scientific evidence in all aspects of cardiac imaging
- Advise the Royal College of Radiologists and the British Cardiovascular Society on cardiac imaging
- Nurture and evolve the links between the cardiology and radiology communities and the patients we serve.

The Society has had significant constraints since March 2020 due to the COVID-19 lockdown. In particular, our Spring Meeting, planned to be held in Keble College, Oxford in March, was cancelled; after aborted attempts to reschedule it this year, it is now planned for September 2021. The BSCI/BSCCT also contributes speakers to other conferences each year, all of which have been cancelled. However, despite the effects of COVID-19, the Society has had a successful year; the main achievements are as follows:

Guidelines and Standards

- The BSCI have partnered with the British Society of Thoracic Imaging to produce a
 guideline document on Reporting incidental coronary and cardiac calcification on
 non-gated thoracic CT. This has been accepted for publication by the British Journal
 of Radiology.
- The BSCI/BSCCT have joined several other national cardiology committees to deliver the 2020 Joint Society Guidelines for the Safe Delivery of MRI for Patients with Cardiac Implantable Electronic Devices. The aim is to provide consensus recommendations for best practice management of patients with CIEDs who require investigation using MRI in the UK. With representation from all involved in the patient pathway (including patients themselves), the aim is clear recommendations which should be adhered to alongside consensus recommendations for where no current guidelines exist or are perceived to conflict.
- We have an active Trainee Committee, who conducted a National Audit for cardiac CT training. The Society has contributed to the National Clinical Standards document for cardiac imaging, for which publication is pending.
- The Standard Committee have led a National Audit in invasive downstream testing after CT coronary angiography following NICE CG95 (2016) [registration ref: CA_2017-18-191]. Data has been collected and analysed; it is intended for presentation before year end.
- The Society presented work electronically at the Virtual SCCT conference 2020, entitled Radiologist Opinions Regarding Reporting Incidental Coronary And Cardiac Calcification On Thoracic CT. It has also conducted a Delphi process to identify priorities in cardiovascular imaging research

Education

- The Society has partnered with the Society of Cardiovascular Computed Tomography to subsidise and deliver online Level 1 Cardiac CT training to UK cardiology and radiology trainees.
- Prior to COVID-19, the Society ran a workshop in October 2019 at the Royal College of Radiology Annual Meeting in Liverpool. Discussing ECG gated CT for those radiologists with little experience.
- Given the cancellation of all face-to-face meetings, the Education Committee has put together a series of webinars, available free to members (https://bsci.org.uk/webinars/).
- The Society has also arranged a day of filming on Friday 15th Jan 2021 in the Heartbeat education centre at UHS. To create BSCI/BSCCT specific video content to help those looking to accredit to Level 2 or above.
- The RCR Travelling Professor in Cardiovascular Imaging programme has been reconfigured to deliver online lectures; dates are currently being arranged.

Accreditation

- The accreditation application process has now completely moved onto an online platform. This commenced in June 2020. This online system replaces the previous application process which involved emailing the required documents to the secretariat.
- The application criteria and instructions with the required links are comprehensively provided on the website.
- The online process allows the applicant to log in to application portal where they can
 upload the documents into each domain. Further instructions are provided in the
 portal for the applicant's viewing. This has allowed the process to become more
 streamlined. Review of applications by the accreditation team is also more efficient
 through the online process.

Trainee Committee

- Cardiology and Radiology trainee representatives continue to sit on the Executive Committee, representing the interests of Imaging trainees to the Society.
- Trainee Committee meetings have continued electronically.
- The Trainee Committee also provides ongoing contributions to educational content for the BSCI website (Image of the Month, Podcast interviews) and public engagement with the society via social media.

BSCI/BSCCT has stable membership over the last year and remains in a financially robust position to deliver the societies aims.
