Treasurer Report: Given by Kevin Brady. Most expenditure is down this year, but we are still £2000 deficit. Nantymoel shop, less donations this year, £13700. Maesteg shop almost the same takings as last year £56242. Book Stall slightly more than last year £6351.

Jayne enquired about Nantymoel shop. As banks and post offices closed, not so much foot fall, nothing we can do to help that. Excess Income over Expenditure -£2071. Jayne thanked Kevin.

Secretary Report: Given by Janet Brady. Donations. £2000 from Hobhouse Trust, £1000 Mrs Clements, £2250 funeral bequests, letters sent to bereaved families. £300 for Christmas people who have had cats from us. £400 via Louise by Ebay, plus standing order. Grants for new floors for catteries resin finish, no cost to MAWS. Insurance up to date but with new company, TOWERGATE. Kitts homed 57, down on last year 40 adults. Neutered 95cats. People taking advantage of CP chip neuter for £5. Assessment forms sent to us from the visit by RSPCA via Battersea Dogs and Cats Home, catteries scored full marks on all findings. Update membership to ADCH. Vet bills down as Shepherds give us discount on everything. Helped more people this tear with vet (80). We do not get vouchers from DT now, so we have helped a lot of people with part and full neuter. Although we are not paying for kennelling now, we are helping more dogs with vet fees and neuter. A motion was put forward by Gareth Howells to give a donation of £3000, to Hope Rescue as they are taking in the dogs we can no longer help. Motion was passed. This is to be revised at the next AGM. Cattery Report: Given by Nicola. 92 Cats rehomed plus 40 from Jan more than last year. 32 in care at present. We have a waiting list, but emergencies will jump the queue. New floors with grant. Flooded out this year Andrew had refurbished to cattery no cost to Maws, but it has cost us £500.

Nicola thanked Andrew, James and Jan for keeping the cattery in operation when she was out of action with a knee replacement operation. Chair thanked Nicola.

J Brady suggested to Maws that we reimburse Nicola with £500 that was spent on cattery repairs. This was agreed by everyone.

Shop Report: Given by C Evans. Lots of donations but a lot of rubbish, people dumping stuff by shop instead of going to the tip. Since a camera car operating in area, many people have been booked for stopping and unloading goods to the shop, this may have an affect on people donating goods. Chair asked local councillor if he could ask highways if the loading/unloading symbols could be removed from outside the shop.
