OBJECTIVES & ACTIVITIES

The promotion of any charitable purpose for the benefit of the community of Berinsfield, Oxfordshire and the surrounding area, by the advancement of education, the protection of health, the relief of poverty, sickness and distress.

ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS

During the past year Berinsfield Information and Volunteer Centre has continued to carry out its main activity providing help and support to the community of Berinsfield and the surrounding areas. On-going changes to the benefit system and Universal Credit bring challenges to both clients and the volunteers, which involves a considerable amount of time and resources.

I was appointed as the new chair in February 2019, as a result of the resignation of Sue Hurley. One new volunteer adviser has been recruited during this last 12 months.

Good links have been established with other agencies and work is carried out in partnership and/or collaboration with SODC, SOHA, the Health Centre, Aspire, Riverside, AgeUK, Wallingford Food Bank, the local Youth Centre, The Berin Centre and the Schools. We also work with the local council and bus club to provide information for parents whose children need a school bus to school.

The centre continues to produce and deliver the Village Voice magazine and runs monthly coffee mornings, which not only provides a funding opportunity, but more importantly is a meeting place for villagers and help to combat loneliness and isolation. The centre also runs a good neighbour scheme and is continuing to try and set up a driving scheme, which has proved difficult. Vouchers for the local Food Bank are distributed, which is a much needed facility in the area and the numbers applying have increased by 36.6% in the past year.

Funding for the centre is becoming harder to obtain and a great deal of time is spent trying to find alternative sources. Caroline and Nicky have worked together looking for other grants to apply for and activities to raise much needed money. The centre relies on the goodwill of the volunteers and the generosity of the funders. The trustees thank all of those who have contributed either financially or with their very valuable time.
