## Section B Structure, governance and management

The Charity is governed by a Constitution dated 22/7/03, as amended on 23/3/04 and 28/2/11 The Charity is constituted as a Trust.

Trustees are selected as follows. The Church Minister is a trustee. At least two other trustees are selected from among the diaconate and the diaconate may appoint church members as trustees such that the trustees drawn from the diaconate are in the majority.

## Section C Objectives and activities

The governing document of the charity sets out the objects, summarised as:

The advancement of the education (including spiritual development) of children below compulsory school age

and

The provision of facilities for recreation for such children in the interest of social welfare and with the object of improving their conditions

Main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects.

The Preschool is open for thirty eight weeks per year and ten three hour sessions per week.

Most children attend Preschool for between two and five three hour sessions per week, but the Preschool has successfully created up to twelve places per day for children to use the thirty hour entitlement.

Children may commence Preschool after their second birthday such that they have the opportunity of two years of preschool education before starting at school.

The Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

## Section D Achievements and performance

The Preschool is rated Outstanding by Ofsted (Oct 2018) The Preschool was open for thirty eight weeks, with ten sessions per week. During the year the Preschool offered up to twelve places per day for children who attended all day. Over 2019 this permitted more than twenty five families to make use of the thirty hour funding entitlement. In total between 38 and 42 children were on the register at any one time, attending for between six hours and thirty five hours per week. This represents a slight drop in cohort size, and some reduction in occupancy levels though the thirty hour funding received by many parents mitigates the impact.

At the end of 2019 the Preschool employs an Early Years Professional, a qualified teacher and five employees with at least Level Three in a full and relevant qualification. All staff are encouraged and supported to gain a relevant qualification and to keep up to date using face to face training and e-learning. Self –evaluation is led by the Preschool Leader with active participation by all team members.

The Preschool Leader has continued to lead a cluster of other local Preschools, supplying a forum for mutual support and development in a way which is suited to the distinctive needs of a local Preschool setting. In 2019 the Preschool arranged a full day training on Safeguarding which the cluster was invited to share. Two settings sent staff to participate.

The setting has supported children in receipt of Disability Living Allowance and successfully applied for Inclusive Practice funding to support several children. During 2019 three children with English as an additional language have been supported in the setting, with their families.

The Preschool works to engage families in their children's learning and supplies resources for families to take home which are tailored to the needs of individual children. The Preschool runs a Drop-In each week for parents or carers to come into the setting and play with their child for part of the session. Each family is encouraged to access the online Learning Journal, Tapestry which gives them another way to engage with their child's learning, add photos, narratives and comments to the record. The Preschool Facebook page provides an insight into the setting's activities for parents, friends and families.

The Preschool continues to work with Speech and Language therapists and other professionals as required to support the children, welcoming visits from primary schools to facilitate transition to F2 for the children in its care.

## Section E Financial review

#### Reserves Policy

The charity holds reserves of £40,000 to meet fluctuations in receipts (being approximately one term's expenditure) plus £20,000 for any necessary investment. The Trustees are aware that equipment requires regular investment to keep the facilities up to date and suitable for the children.

At the year-end, unrestricted cash reserves were just under £83,000.

On a Receipts and Payments basis, the charity has virtually broken even.

In light of the COVID-19 outbreak, the trustees are monitoring income and expenditure and, if it becomes necessary, will take measures to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the charity's free reserves.
