## **Report of the Trustees**

The Trustees of The Oxford School of Thought present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 1 April 2020. In the very latter part of the year, the decision was taken to energise the organisation and commence its work which has been some four years in its preparation. The results and activities will be better presented in the annual report for the year ended 1 April 2021 but I am pleased to give an outline of the activities up to and including September 30th, 2020.

#### **Review of Activities and Achievements**

Over the past 5 years OST has been gaining knowledge, reviewing and renewing contacts and building a team of likeminded individuals with the experience and drive to change the landscape in Education moving towards a position where it is best placed to promote the changes needed. Since March OST has been actively planning the generation of open public debate in a way which will lead to innovation and advancement in educational practice to improve the lives of all.

#### **Aims and Objectives**

The Oxford School of Thought was founded by educators as a truly independent Primary Education think tank - the first of its kind in the UK - to advance the public exchange of ideas generated and opinions discussed between experts in their field in the world of education. This will include research and much wider distribution and consumption of material. The intention is to have a positive impact on the way that education is delivered, whether state or independent (private).

#### The current situation

Whist there are numerous education conferences in which some ideas are generated, the majority are for educators, delivered by educators, and the vast majority of attendees are those in senior positions or have the time to spend attending conferences. Speakers and contributors are often uttering warm words of wisdom but achieving very little change. Seldom are policy makers present, few if any parents are invited.

Generally, the entire process is inward looking.

At the time of writing, the entire education landscape has changed by an invisible and unforeseen (for many) virus which has wreaked havoc on the plans of so many people around the world. As entire communities have locked down and schools been closed, the previous natural process of



educating children has been overturned. The difference in attainment or achievement between the 'have's and have-nots' has increased dramatically this has led many to join the discussion about changing the way we educate children, OST will be at the forefront of this discussion.

## Future

This next year marks the beginning of our substantial efforts to influence policy makers. Following the successful rebuild and launch of our website and with the active participation of our extended team and the list of well- known associates who are supporting us, we have planned a series of live recorded short talks. Speakers have been carefully curated to express views and share knowledge and thinking across education and those who recruit the output from the education processes. Audiences for these events will have the unique opportunity of discussing all phases of the education cycle. The recording, with high quality productions, will enable a much wider audience to be informed.

We intend to deliver our aims and objectives through this series of live events, research and much wider distribution and consumption of material.

We look forward to reporting our progress and achievements in our next Trustees Report for the year ended 1 April 2021.
