Introduction

The Charity's main purpose is the provision and maintenance of fifteen single and five double units of Almshouse accommodation situated across Hurst (three sites) and Twyford (one site) in Berkshire.

Harrison Almshouses, London Road, Twyford, built 1660

This site consists of five single-storey apartments (three single and two double) in a courtyard setting. During the year one single house became vacant due to the resident moving away. This property underwent complete re-decoration with the installation of a new kitchen and new flooring throughout.

William Barker Almshouses, Church Hill, Hurst, built 1664 and 1980

The original eight single two-storey dwellings underwent complete refurbishment in the 1980's. This resulted in a reconfiguration of the original houses to create four single-storey more spacious and comfortable homes. Four new bungalows were built to house the residents while the above work was carried out. This site now offers five single and three double homes in a courtyard setting with extensive gardens.

Lodge Close Almshouses, Hinton Road, Hurst, built 1960

A terrace of four single occupancy bungalows occupy this site. It was originally built by Lady Ingram of Hurst Lodge to house retired nurses. The houses were later donated to the Charity by the Ingram family. Richard Bigg Almshouses, Hinton Road, Hurst, built 2019

This new build comprises a terrace of single-storey units on spare land adjacent to Lodge Close. The accommodation consists of two units for single occupancy and one for double occupancy. The project was completed in July 2019, with residents moving into their new homes during August. The work was funded from the Charity's reserves and loans from the Charity Bank and the Almshouse Association.

Residents

Twenty-one residents aged between fifty-two and ninety-six years are housed in the Almshouses. This is an increase on the previous year of four residents due to a new build project being completed.

Administration

A Fire Risk Assessment has been carried out on all sites with rectification actions in hand.

The Charity has changed bank to the Unity Trust Bank plc.

All gas boilers were serviced by British Gas and Landlord Safety Certificates issued.

Twenty Year-6 school leavers from St Nicholas School, Hurst were presented with bibles as indicated in the will of the late Dame Dorothy Harrison 1664.

The naming of the Richard Bigg Almshouses: this was chosen because in his will of 20th July 1677 Richard Bigg of Haines Hill, Hurst left the George Inn and two houses in the parish of St Giles, Middlesex to be sold to provide bread for the poor in the parish of Hurst. The bread was to be placed in a basket and put upon his tomb in St Nicholas Church every Sunday during divine service. After the service the bread was distributed among the "most indigent and helpless poor of the said parish of Hurst". Over time the Bread Charity was incorporated as part of today's Hurst Consolidated Charity.

Trustees

Mr Edwards was proposed and elected to serve as Chairman for 2019-2020 Mr Winchester, representative trustee for Twyford Parish Council, resigned in November 2019 due to work commitments.

Summary

The Charity continues to provide high quality, affordable housing for local people.

The buildings benefit from regular upgrading and improvement works, along with day to day maintenance carried out as required. Grounds are regularly mowed and tended to by Charity's gardener, with residents being encouraged to care for their own flowerbeds.
