### Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	The group undertook several productions during the year including a full musical show in November and plays in February and June. In addition, the youth arm performed a full musical shown in August.
	About £2,000 was raised from membership subscriptions and other non specific donations, all of which was allocated to the charity, to go towards show costs and other events. This was lower than last year. In addition we received a legacy of £10,000. There was also a gift aid income of about £ 2,300. This was lower than the previous year as one adult show was cancelled and the youth show had a significantly smaller cast. Our social secretary resigned in 2019 and with the time taken to replace her, there was little social activity giving virtually no net income. It was initially planned to produce Hello Dolly in April. However, it proved impossible to recruit enough men to the cast, and so this had to be cancelled, incurring a loss of about £ 1,500.
	The charity's main production in 2019 was Legally Blonde in November. It attracted a large audience, very similar to 2018. Unfortunately, increased costs of rehearsal hire, sound and lighting hit us hard, and the show lost about $\pounds$ 4,500. The youth section performed Urinetown in August. This was designed to coincide with high public awareness of environmental issues. The title however had some negative impact and the cast was smaller than normal. However, the show proved reasonably popular with audiences,

and the quality of the production was excellent. Overall the show made a small profit of about $\pounds$ 200. For the drama group, the team performed Agatha Crusty in February and Steel Magnolias in June, both at Ifield Barn. The growing reputation of the drama group ensured good audiences, and with our new venue helping to keep costs, the drama group contributed almost $\pounds$ 1,000 profit Overall the society made just over $\pounds$ 11,000 in 2019. While on paper this looks excellent, it should be borne in mind that the majority of this came from the significant legacy mentioned earlier. Nonetheless, the society would have just been in profit without the legacy, and there are now over $\pounds$ 50,000 worth of funds that should ensure financial stability moving forwards.

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves	The charity's policy is to retain sufficient funds to continue putting on the same quality and scale of productions year on year. To this end it endeavours to break even and ideally gradually increase funds in line with inflation over time. The idea is to put on a mix of shows, some to achieve a profit and some for their artistic merit alone. Each main show costs £30k - £40k to put on, so the trustees need to have this amount in the bank at the end of each year. Current funds are c. £50k, so we are still in a position where we can safely put on these main shows.
