Structure, governance and management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and to stand for election to the PCC.

St Nicholas Church is part of the Warwick Team Ministry.

Objectives and activities

The PCC of St Nicholas Church has the responsibility of cooperating with the Team Vicar, the Rev'd Linda Duckers, in promoting, in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has responsibility for the Church premises at St Nicholas Church Street, Warwick. The parish also seeks to support the Warwick Team Ministry, the Deanery and the Diocese.

These objectives and activities are considered to fulfil the Charity Commissioners' requirements regarding public benefit.

Risk Review

The PCC of St Nicholas Church has considered the major risks (both financial and otherwise) that could occur. The process of assurance with regard to all risks is currently being reviewed by the PCC with the intention of agreeing a process that ensures annual review of all risks. This will be reviewed on an annual basis.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the PCC to hold in general reserves the equivalent of six months' general running costs (approximately £42,500), to cover emergency situations that may arise. In addition to this the PCC will designate an amount to building reserves to meet future costs of maintaining the ancient building. At the end of 2019 the balances of £47,040 in general reserves, £33,000 in mission reserves, £77,190 in building reserves and £12,627 legacies received in 2019 cover these amounts. This policy will be reviewed in twelve months' time.

Achievements and Performance

Church attendance

There are 104 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll. This compares with 100 in April 2019. The average weekly attendance, counted during October was 58 adults and 5 children, but this number increases considerably at festivals, and particularly at the Christmas Crib service, Harvest Festival services, Remembrance Day and Mothering Sunday service.

Review of the year

The full PCC met 9 times during the year and a majority of the members were present at each meeting. Committees met between meetings and minutes of their deliberations were received by the full PCC and discussed where necessary.

Financial Review

The accounts for 2019 show a deficit of £223 (surplus of £28,007 in 2018): Unrestricted funds increased by £2,040 from £45,000 to £47,040 Designated funds increased by £12,627 from £110,190 to £122,817 Restricted funds decreased by £14,890 from £124,470 to £109,580

Points to note from the year are:

- Receipts from giving including income tax claims increased to £58,510 (£57,842 in 2018).
- Income from church bookings reduced to £2,629 (£4,231 in 2018).
- Income from the King Henry VIII Endowed Trust was £33,627 (£33,250 in 2018). This income is restricted for furthering the religious and other charitable work of the Church in the parish. See note 3(b) which details exactly how this grant was used in 2019. The PCC is very grateful for all Henry funding and thanks the trustees for their generosity.
- Two legacies were received in 2019 (£12,627) and have been accounted for in designated funding until a decision is made how to use the legacies.
- Building maintenance and running costs were £33,648 (£17,830 in 2018). This included £6,768 on floor sanding and also £7,074 on flood lights which was claimed from insurance.
- In order to meet recommendations outlined in the Quinquennial Report, £20,566 was paid out of Henry funding for repairs to the external stonework and glazing on the north side of the church. We have claimed the VAT on this work from the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme.
- Half of the salary and costs of the Myton Hospice Chaplain are paid by all the churches that receive income from the King Henry VIII Endowed Trust. This was £3,796 (£3824 in 2018).
- Other charitable giving was £7,020 (£5,850 in 2018). In addition to this £1,000 (£1,050 in 2018) was paid out to charities from funds raised at T4U on Woodloes in 2019.
- £27,941 was paid to the Diocese (training and voluntary contribution to the support fund) (£25,224 in 2018). The Diocese receives payment for Revd Linda Duckers' stipend, NI, pension and housing costs directly from the King Henry VIII Endowed Trust.

Investments

The market value of the Lees Bequest increased during the year by £9,563 to £60,689.

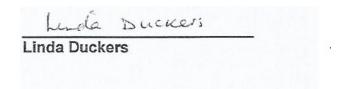
Going Concern

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

St. Nicholas' Church Warwick is a charity registered in England and Wales with charity number 1131835 and its principal place of activity is St Nicholas' Church, St Nicholas Church Street, Warwick, CV34 4JD.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

The Financial Statements for the single entity St Nicholas' Church Warwick have been prepared in accordance with the Church Regulations 1997 as amended by the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable Accounting Standards FRS 102 (Charities) (small) and Statement of Recommended Practice for Charities 2011.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of fixed asset investments which are stated at market value.

The Financial Statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity and rounded to the nearest £.

Judgements and Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements the trustees have had to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Estimates and associated assumptions are based on historic experience and various other factors including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, however actual results may differ from these estimates.

For this reporting date there are no significant judgements, estimates and assumptions which have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

Funds

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application to the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also unrestricted.

The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible.

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC.

Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received.

Income tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised when received.

Income from investments

Interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue.

Resources expended

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over or when awarded.

Activities directly relating to the work of the church

The amounts payable to the Coventry Diocesan Board of Finance (Training Share and Support Fund) are accounted for when paid.

Current Assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of grants, rent or other income are shown as debtors.

Other current assets include short term deposits with Lloyds Bank and other accounts with CAF Bank Ltd and Lloyds Bank.

Fixed Assets

Investments are made up of a bequest which is held in income units in The CBF Church of England Investment Fund. This is valued at market value.

Fixtures and fittings are depreciated on a straight line basis varying from three to twenty years at rates estimated to write each asset off over its useful life.

Financial instruments

The charity only has basic financial instruments.

• Financial Assets

Financial assets comprise items such as cash at bank and in hand and trade and other debtors. These are initially recorded at cost on the date they originate, the charity considers the evidence of impairment for all individual elements comprising financial assets and any subsequent impairment is recognised in profit and loss.

• Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities comprise items such as corporation and other taxes, bank and other loans, accruals and trade and other creditors. These are initially recorded at cost on the date they originate, net of transaction costs where applicable, the charity considers the evidence of the impairment for all individual elements comprising financial liabilities and any subsequent impairment is recognised in profit and loss.

15. KING HENRY VIII ENDOWED TRUST

The church is one of five in Warwick and Budbrooke that is the recipient of annual payments from the Trust, which was set up in 1545. The amount to be paid to the Church is set out in the Trust's Scheme, which is approved by the Charity Commission. All payments are Restricted and can only be used for the prescribed purpose for which they are given.

The five churches receive 50% of the Trust's net distribution and this amount is allocated in accordance with the Scheme. From this, payments are first allocated for the payment of stipends, pensions and housing costs for nominated clergy and lay workers within the five parishes in a set order. The balance is then allocated to the PCCs and the Project Pool. St Nicholas' is currently entitled to 13%, which can only be used for furthering the religious and other charitable work of the Church of England in the five parishes. The Trustees have the discretion to change this percentage allocation.

A variation to the allocation of the church share has now been agreed between the Trustees and the PCC's of the five parishes to set up the Project Pool. The Project Pool is managed by the parishes, approved by Team Council and subsequently ratified by the King Henry Trustees. The PCCs of the five parishes bid for funds for specific projects. In 2019 the Project Pool funded two initiatives (Acceler8 and Transforming Communities Together). The Acceler8 project is focused on ministry to the 20's and 30's. The Transforming Communities Together project is focused on developing work with the elderly and isolated as well as with families and young people. St Nicholas had no projects approved during the year, but did have funds left over from the previous year for the Children's and Families Worker, which was spent in 2019.

Up to the end of 2018 the final two quarterly payments plus the balancing payment were paid by the Trust in the subsequent year. From 2019 all payments due for the year will be paid in the year so it is no longer necessary to allow for any Henry debtors at the end of the year.
