#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Mothers' Union is an Anglican organisation which promotes the well-being of families worldwide. The charity is governed by a constitution approved on 3 November 2003 and updated on 10 July 2012. The Trustees control and manage the affairs of the charity in the Diocese.

Trustees are elected for a three year period initially and may stand for re-election for a further three years. In cases of unfilled positions, the existing board may appoint a suitable person to fill the role.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT (continued)

#### **Reserves Policy**

The charity has established a policy whereby the surplus funds not otherwise committed should be the equivalent of one year's expenditure. We consider that the equivalent of 12 months resources will give the charity sufficient funds to continue our current activities in the event of a significant reduction in funding

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The aim and objectives of the Mothers' Union is the advancement of Christian religion in the sphere of marriage and family life and to be specially concerned with all that strengthens and preserves marriage and Christian family life.

The Trustees have examined the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to those major risks.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

The annual theme for the Mothers' Union has been 'Listen, Observe, Act - In Step with God' This slogan, in so many ways, identifies what this charity is all about. We listen to people in need, see what action is needed and then, in consultation with them, act to help those in adversity irrespective of their religion, colour or background. So, it is with this theme in mind that meetings, activities and projects have been enhanced and initiated. Members are involved in a wide variety of projects depending on their skills and for people in need both locally and otherwise.

The A F I A (Away from it all) caravan continues to be a major part of our fundraising and prayers. It provides opportunities for people who cannot afford a holiday or are perhaps in desperate need of a break away from their surroundings. The branches have taken it in turns to provide a weekly box of groceries as a welcome from the M.U. We have bought new covers and curtains for the inside and anticipate that the decking and external furniture will have to be replaced in 2020. We are looking at the possibility of organising an away day - to the seaside or a child friendly farm as another option for 2020 though still being aware that we may have to replace the caravan due to its heavy usage.

Prayer is an integral part of Mothers' Union and during 2019 the 3 archdeaconries worked to consolidate the Prayer Chains in their own areas. This project is to be enhanced in 2020 to include the Diocesan Members in a more proactive way. This follows on from the very successful "Cross in the Pocket scheme. Originally just given to the Yorkshire Regiment, pocket crosses are now being given as part of baptism and couple preparing for marriage. Quiet days have been held to refresh our faith and those who "just want to join us". Members have also led prayers and services in churches across the diocese.

Promotional leaflets for our charity have been 'on the back burner' for the past year or so, 2020 should see the members and Trustees pooling their ideas to produce pamphlets for the members (such as prayer bookmarks) and general information leaflets, for the public in general, about M.U. projects - such as the A F I A caravan, 'the knit and natter' groups in Scarborough teaching handicraft skill to local teenagers, and baby changing tents at local agricultural shows. This last item is a new venture, started in the Hull deanery and in 2019 has seen an increase in M U led tents at such shows. It is hoped this venture will reach out to more people at other similar events e.g. festivals and fun days.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE (continued)

Projects this year have been varied and relate to the skills of members. Knitting is a popular activity - mainly because it is portable and can be taken anywhere - to meetings, whilst on our twice-yearly retreat, or 'local knit and natter' groups. 'Trauma teddies' have been made for children who are ill, or injured or suffering sadness during family bereavement or divorce. These have been given out to the appropriate authorities to distribute as they feel necessary.

The Trustees are aware of the 'Red box Project' a national campaign to provide free feminine hygiene and period products across the county. It was decided that for 2019, members across the diocese, would be encouraged to put a couple of such products in their weekly shopping basket and bring them to meetings or our twice-yearly Council Meeting. Over the last twelve months the amount donated has been incredible and knowing the Government has, at last decided to take action to tackle the issues of 'period poverty' by girls in England. We are now looking at another project to help those in need, that can involve all the members for 2020... perhaps helping refugees, schools or the homeless. Our work at the local prisons continues especially at Hull Prison where members volunteer to help in the crèche during visiting hours, and working with the Chaplaincy team with 'family days'. It is hoped that for 2020 to reinstate sending Christmas cards to prisoners as quite a number do not receive any correspondence from anyone. Also, we are looking at ways to offer help at a local women's prison - depending on what help they ask for.

Partnership with others groups worked in 2019. Two members have been heavily committed with the Mothers' Union National Parenting Group Facilitation course. They have passed level 3 and wish them success as they take these skills forward into the community.

Members are also involved with Messy Church and Open the Book ventures. Volunteering with other groups is a sound way of sharing ones concerns and working out solutions. MULOA in action again, and so it continues. At a rough calculation there are at least 100 schemes that The Mothers' Union York Diocese are involved with. It is hoped to strengthen such schemes in 2020. It is important to be aware of the skills of our members and to utilise them fully whilst encouraging them to try new ones.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

The results for the year are as shown on pages 6 to 17 of these accounts.

#### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The theme for 2020 is 'Building Hope and Confidence. The process of MULOA (Mothers' Union, Listen, Observe and Act) has worked well for 2019 and shapes the way forward for us as a Christian movement. This new theme aims to help us to live out our faith, to build hope and confidence in ourselves as well as those we support.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

#### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is 12 Sir John Hunt Cottages, Fulford Road, Fulford, York, YO10 4PG.

#### 2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

#### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### (a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

#### (b) Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### (c) Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires trustees to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. With respect to the next accounting period the most significant area of uncertainty that affect the carrying value of assets held by the charity are the level of investment return and the performance of the investment markets.

#### (d) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity. Restricted funds are funds which can only be used for a particular restricted purpose within the objects of the charity.

#### (e) Incoming resources

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.

#### Incoming resources (continued)

- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

#### (f) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

#### (g) Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

#### (h) Investments

Investments are a form of basic financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at their fair value as at the balance sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluation and disposals throughout the year.

The main form of financial risk faced by the charity is that of volatility in equity markets and investment markets due to wider economic conditions, the attitudes of investors to investment risk, and changes in sentiment concerning equities and within particular sectors or sub sectors.

#### (I) Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase, costs of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

#### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### (j) Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.
