Structure, Governance and Management Governing Document

Barnstaple Musical Comedy & Dramatic Society (BMCDS) is a not-for-profit company limited by guarantee and is also a registered charity. It is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust.

Appointment of Board Members

As set out in the governing document, the Directors are appointed by the members at the Annual General Meeting.

Where casual vacancies arise, the Directors may appoint a Director to serve as a Board Member until the next Annual General Meeting, at which point they are required to retire but will be eligible for re-election.

Organisation

The Board of Directors meet monthly and are responsible for administering the company, having regard to advice from the development executive and other advisors.

Risk Management

The Directors have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the company is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The Directors have examined the major risks that BMCDS faces and this has resulted in additional efforts to increase its donor base.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of BMCDS are to educate the public in the dramatic and musical arts and to further the development of public appreciation and taste in the said arts by the promotion and public performance of plays, drama, comedy and other dramatic and musical work. When carrying out the activities of the charity the directors have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Achievements and performance (Chairman's Report)

Centre Stage

As you will see the refurbishment of Centre Stage is well under way however this isn't the only change that has happened here in the last 12 months. Towards the end of last year, the committee met and discussed everything involved in BMCDS and worked out a longer-term plan of how we saw the society developing in the future. One big area we agreed on was that Centre Stage School couldn't thrive and grow whilst still being part of the BMCDS group. The committee felt it would be better if Helen Cole could take the school on herself and finally really make it her own. When meeting with Helen, we were delighted that she had also invited Trevor Wayborn along: one of the founder members of Centre Stage. After some discussion we agreed that we would hand Centre Stage School over to both Helen and Trev and allow them to build on its success. I would like to wish them both the very best as they move on to the next chapter of the Centre Stage School story once they are allowed to re-open.

So with the stage school settling into its new home we moved onto the next stage of our plan by making The Centre Stage Venue something that is more versatile and fit for putting on more events and performances whilst still keeping it as our home and rehearsal space. We have longer term plans to produce more events here over the coming years making this venue somewhere that is recognised as North Devon's premier performance space and really putting us 'Centre Stage'.

We are also taking on specific external hirers that fit into our own timetable. Centre Stage was always meant to be a rehearsal space for BMCDS, however there are so many times that the building isn't used and we're actively filling those slots. We are delighted to welcome the La Tragna Dance Academy and India Harris from Slimming World who will be using Centre Stage throughout the year. We feel that these partnerships really work well together and are looking forward to re-opening as soon as we can.

42nd Street

So, moving back to over 12 months ago where we performed the truly amazing, foot tapping extravaganza 42nd Street. From the very first curtain rise to the last curtain call this show was a triumph. When we chose to perform 42nd Street we were concerned that there might not be enough strong tap dancers in North Devon who wanted to be part of the production, and how wrong we were. From that very first audition day onwards, it was clear that the cast were on top form and ready for anything and by show time the audiences were treated to the high energy that poured off the stage. Huge thanks go to our director Ian, musical director Michael, our amazing choreographer Lynne, to our costume coordinator Caroline, our back-stage team headed up by Brian, and our producer Barbara.

Haunting of Hill House

Due to the timings of our other musical productions, this year we chose not to use our theatre slot for our usual musical, but to produce a play at Centre Stage instead. We had already been discussing production ideas with our directors Chris and Martin, and when the idea of The Haunting of Hill House came up, we felt that the Halloween weekend in October would be the ideal time.

From the very beginning Chris and Martin wanted our audience members to be immersed in the whole experience. Rather than just going to watch a play, they wanted people to enter Hill House itself and feel the whole atmosphere. Huge thanks to both Chris and Martin for their sheer hard work and their vision. To Sandi for our costumes, to Trev and the whole back-stage team who had the task of making all the special effects work. Also, to Julie our Producer for keeping everything on track.

Chicago

We now move forward to February and our production of Chicago. Due to the licence restrictions we were only allowed to sell 1,500 tickets for the whole production, so we decided to split this over three performances in two days. Due to further restrictions we were only allowed to perform within certain dates. This gave us very few options with availability at the Queen's Theatre.

A huge thanks to Jake for his vision of staging this production. To Sarah our choreographer who really put the cast through their paces. Thank you to Sandi for coordinating the costumes (or the lack of them) and to Julie our producer. Thank you to the back-stage team headed up by Ian and Lee for everything that went on behind the scenes and for hand making our beautiful illuminated letters.

One thing that made my job a whole lot easier was having Glen as our sound engineer. He took an active role in many rehearsals and even brought in microphones and a sound system for our last few rehearsals which was really helpful; so a big thank you to you Glen.

As you will know, because of the sell-out success of Chicago we managed to secure a further licence for two extra performances in March. Unfortunately, we know the difficult situation that was to unfold and our second run was cancelled. Who knows, we might take another visit to Chicago in the future but for now it will have to remain in the history book as another great success for BMCDS.

Joseph

As we moved on into the spring, we auditioned and started rehearsals for Joseph. Unfortunately, as we moved through February into March it became clear that we would have to restrict access to rehearsals and then ultimately cancel rehearsals all together. Our initial hope was that we could push rehearsals back a few weeks and then restart them in time for the show in May half term. It became clear that this was not going to be possible and the theatre cancelled our booking. As we look forward, we have managed to secure the licence for Joseph again for the May half term week in 2021. Due of the time lapse between shows we have decided to return all production fees, extend BYG membership and then re-audition the show again early next year. With everything still up in the air we can't promise anything, but we are working towards Joseph Revisited in 2021. Thanks go to Ian, Lynne, Amber and Julie for their work so far and hopefully we will all be back soon.

Voices

BMCDS Voices continues to be a great addition to the BMCDS family. Over the past 12 months they have been working hard on new material and performing in concerts at the end of each term and carol singing at Christmas. As things stand, singing in groups is still not allowed but when we do get

the all clear, BMCDS Voices will be back again singing the all-time great songs from the shows. If you've ever fancied coming along for a good sing, make sure you keep an eye out for updates and come along when we reopen.

Looking Forward

As we look forward to the coming 12 months and beyond, we are still planning and remain ever hopeful that we will be able to continue to perform high quality musicals in the Queen's Theatre. However, we fully understand that the theatre world is in great turmoil and we need to plan for every eventuality.

So, our plans for 2021 are to perform Joseph with BYG in May with Kinky Boots following along in October. We have been able to move our licence for Shrek the Musical to October 2022 (which seems such a long way off). We are also hoping to be able to increase the number of events and performances here at Centre Stage and possible other venues. Please keep an eye out for our updates on social media, we are doing everything we can to be back up and running and doing what we love as soon as possible

Finances

As I say every year, keeping a society of this size running on a financial level is a huge task. I would like to thank Julie our treasurer and Barbara who looks after the Centre Stage accounts for all their hard work throughout the year. I would like to thank Paul and Bernadene Gould from James Electrics Contracting for being our Society Sponsor again this year. Our long-standing relationship continues to grow, and we are proud and honoured to have you with us.

As you will see from our accounts, we have had another successful year financially and long may this success continue.

Financial Review

Investment Powers and Policy

Under its governing document, the company has the power to invest in any way the Directors see fit and having regard to the liquidity requirements of operating the company.

Reserves policy

The directors aim to maintain sufficient money in the bank to be in a position to meet any unexpected expenditure. At the year-end Cash at bank and in hand came to £73,870 (2019 £43,749), a figure considered more than adequate

Dissolution

Every member of the company undertakes to contribute amounts (but not exceeding £1) towards the settlement of the company's debts and liabilities if it is wound up. If, after settlement of all debts, there are funds remaining, these will be transferred to another charitable organisation with the same or similar objectives to BMCDS.

Directors' Responsibilities for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company Law requires the directors to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year. Under that law the Directors have elected to prepare the Financial Statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (Financial Reporting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the Directors must not approve the Financial Statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the net incoming or outgoing resources of the company for that period.

1 **Accounting Policies**

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011.

Incoming Resources

The income shown in the Statement of Financial Activities represents:

- Income from donations and grants recognised where there is an entitlement, certainty of the receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability;
- Income from charitable activities on an accrual basis; and
- Income from investments on a received basis.

When donors specify that funds given to the charity are for use in future accounting periods, such income is deferred until those periods.

Resources Expended

Resources expended are accounted for in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accrual basis.

Restricted funds

Restricted funds are funds given for a specific purpose.
