Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principal activities of the Charity have been:

- a) To advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of beliefs appearing in the Schedule hereto in London and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit.
- b) To relieve persons who are in conditions of need or hardship or who are aged or sick and to relieve the distress caused thereby in London and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit.
- c) To advance education in accordance with Christian principles in London and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit.
- d) To promote and fulfil such other charitable purposes beneficial to the community in London and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The charity continues to achieve a study growth in several areas of the church.

This year, the charity embarked on community service whereby we donated several food items to the Enfield Food Bank and the homeless action in Barnet.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The charity continues to have a healthy financial position although voluntary income decreased by 10.8%. Overall, the total funds of the charity increased to £1,518,849 as compared to £1,427,429 in the previous year.

Reserves policy

The Charity aims to retain sufficient reserve equivalent to a minimum of three months overhead commitments of £36,000, these reserves are held in liquid funds and this level of reserves has been maintained during most of the period in question.

Going concern

Based on the forecast and projections and performance of the Charity, the Board of Trustees is of the opinion that ICC (House of Prayer) has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The governing instructment of the charity is its adopted constitution (Trust deed) dated 12 January 1998.

Trustee are appointed by agreement of a quorum of the current trustees. The trustees meet at least 4 times in the year. The day to day operation of the charity is controlled and managed by the trustees.

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the operations and finance of the charity and are satisfied that systems and controls are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Incoming resources

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be receive and the amount can be measured reliably.

Voluntary income is received by way of donations, offering and tithe and is accounted for in the statement of financial activities on receivable basis.

Donations under Gift Aid plus associated tax recovery are recognised as income when the donation is received.

Resource expanded

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular heading, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs represents direct expenditure on the governance of the church, including the production and independent scrutiny of these financial statements.

Support costs are those costs incurred indirectly in support of expenditure on the objectives of the Charity.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - Straight line over 160 years

Plant and machinery - 15% on cost Motor vehicles - 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

The Charity had no restricted funds in the current or previous year.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease.
