Report of the Trustees For the Year Ended 31 December 2019

The Trustees present the report with the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2019

Structure, Governance and Management.

Governing Document

Horton & Chalbury Village Hall is a registered charity governed by a scheme on 4th August 1977 as an unincorporated charity with administrative amendments passed by a Resolution dated 19th September 2011

Trustees

The Trustees of the Charity shall be:-

- i) the elected members of the Committee of Management; and
- ii) if they so consent, the representative members.

Committee of Management

The Committee when complete shall consist of:-

- (a) up to 6 elected members;
- (b) two representative members, one appointed by each of the Knowlton Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council of Horton and Chalbury (the Councils);
- (c) up to 4 co-opted members provided that the number of co-opted members shall not exceed the number of elected members at any time.

Objectives and Activities

The object of the charity shall be:

- 1. The provision and maintenance of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of the parishes of Horton and Chalbury and surrounding areas without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, including use for meetings, lectures and classes, and for other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants.
- 2. The land and buildings shall be held upon trust for the purpose of a village hall.

Report of the Trustees (continued) for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

Chairman's Report for Horton & Chalbury Village Hall 2019/20

September 2019 was the tenth anniversary of the opening of our new Village Hall and we celebrated with a free Barn Dance open to all. The operation of the Hall continues to develop thanks to our Trustees, our expanding and hard-working Management Committee, and our part-time Administrator who manages hires and bookings.

We have been fortunate to have a number of Trustees who were part of the original build team and who have given unstintingly of their time and experience. In particular we should mention Colin Agnew and David Shand, who have now partly stepped down due to changes in circumstances but who still support the Hall in many ways.

As our Treasurer makes clear in her report, the outcome for 2019 was extremely successful, both financially and in terms of community opportunities and involvement. Regular hires increased again in number and variety, and included the Hall being used for a small group being professionally taught 'out of school'. Regular fund-raising activities such as the Fete, Cream Teas, Harvest supper, Quiz night, Music Night, and winter Tea and Talks have all been very well supported and often bring in new faces . Many of these events support Charities other than the Hall.

Two members of the Committee initiated the provision of a Defibrillator based beside the Hall entrance for which the training sessions attracted 38 people.

We are grateful, once again, to the Knowlton Community Fund which has supported some equipment and maintenance. Our Hall remains one of the most attractive and well-kept in the area and is, as it should be, the centre of community activities in our villages.

As I write this we are in the throes of the Covid-19 pandemic, which has obviously caused our Hall to be closed for several months with reduced activities likely for some time to come. Fortunately due to prudent past financial management and a Government grant we are making sure that once life resumes our Hall will be immediately available to enable its use by the community.

Treasurer's Report

Our general hire fee income has increased by almost 40% over the last year to £17,930. Reasons for this include increased regular hires; pilates is now on twice a week instead of once a week, we have a new dance class every other Thursday and a group supporting adults with learning difficulties that meets every other Saturday morning.

We promote the hall more using our website, social media and by producing a newsletter. We held a free to attend barn dance to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the opening of the hall and invited the whole of Horton and Chalbury and welcomed some new faces.

Treasurer's Report (continued)

The wedding hires and fundraising income were both at a similar level to the previous year. Expenditure increased by just over £2,000 which is mainly due to an increase in repairs and maintenance. We spent £1,000 on drain repairs and invested in a new computer and printer for our administrator, a new vacuum cleaner, new signs for cream teas and a new cupboard in which to store the audio-visual equipment.

Tangible Fixed Assets
