Structure, Governance and Management

The Parochial Church Council is a corporate body established by the Church of England. The PCC operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure. The PCC is a charity excepted by order from registration with the Charity Commission.

The method of appointment of the PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

Objectives and Activities

The PCC's objectives and operations are framed in the context of the church as a fellowship of believers who belong to Christ and who worship him as Lord. We seek:

- To come closer to God through the study of the Bible and prayer.

- To serve the local community and the wider world in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- To help others to belong to Christ through caring and sharing in God's Good News and love.

Electoral Roll

As at 31 December 2019 there were 66 members (78 members at 31.12.18).

The number of usual attendees on Sunday reported to the APCM for 2019 is 67 adults at 11.00am.

The PCC met for 5 ordinary meetings, since the 2019 APCM.

Throughout this year we acknowledge and give our heartfelt thanks that God is always with us, constant and faithful. Duncan leads us in our services, preaching God's Word from the Bible and we continue to pray for him that his walk with God is faithful and true and he seeks God in all areas of his work. We pray that by listening to God's Word we will all be filled with the Holy Spirit to love and serve. We give thanks for Joy Wood and her work with the younger children within our church family. We also give thanks for Andrew Marshal who worked with the older young people but decided he could not continue in 2020. Leonie also departed at the end of 2019 leaving to work in Cheshire and she has been greatly missed. We pray for her and Andrew's journey with the Lord to remain firm and strong.

Special thanks to the other children's leaders who have continued week by week to teach and encourage the younger children. We have lost some of the leaders over the past months and we pray that others will be called to come forward to serve in these roles. A working party has been putting together a Job Description and other necessary information so that a Children's, Youth and Family Leader can be appointed.

We are thankful for St Mary's Centre, providing a wonderful resource for the groups which meet week by week. The Benefice Office is now established in the Centre. The monthly Lunch Club has been quite well attended and we give thanks for the speakers and for all the team who work to prepare and serve the food. We pray that more people from our community will be encouraged to join and share this time of fellowship and friendship.

We praise our loving and constant Lord for his presence and guidance in all areas of our lives. In March 2020 all our lives were affected by the Covid 19 Pandemic. We pray that we will all continue to support and work together through these difficult times to bring more people in our community to come to know and love the Lord.

Financial Report for the Year to 31 December 2019

The total receipts on unrestricted funds was £64,624.24 A total of £62,989.19 was used to provide Christian Ministry from St Mary's Church, , the contribution to Parish Share and the running costs of the Benefice; with additional funds totalling £4,182.38 being transferred to either designated or restricted funds. Receipts on restricted funds for the year to 31/12/18 was £45,900 which includes £9,867.39 for Friends of St. Mary's. Also included in this is the Fee Account, which is for the parishes of Sileby, Cossington and Seagrave, On the advice of the Diocese we only show the excess of

receipts over payments relating to St Mary's in the account.(see also note 6 in the accounts). Gift Aid has been received from HMRC for all qualifying donations to 30th November 2019. £2,000 has been set aside towards the eventual replacement of our church central heating boiler. The lunch club has proved financially viable, with an end balance of £140.26 after a gift to a local charity of £600. Gifts totalling £1,100 were sent to Chris and Kesia Pain in 2019.

Independent examiner's report to the members of St Mary's Church, Sileby, Parochial Church Council.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

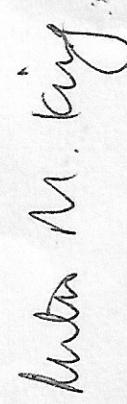
My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission.

The financial statements of the PCC have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 using the receipts and payments basis.

2. FUNDS

Unrestricted funds are general funds which can be used for PCC ordinary purposes.

The Designated Fund represents monies assigned to Quinquennial report (CARRIED OUT IN 2015)
and towards future repair/replacement of church boiler.

Restricted Funds represent accumulated funds from donations and appeals, plus apportioned interest, which
can only be spent for those specific purposes.
