We wish them well in their retirement form Scouting. Adult training continues with 14 Wood Badges being gained over the year and continued attendance at the County Training Academies high than ever. Jane Thompson has joined the District Team as the Local Training Manager. The District Team of ADC's, District Scouters, Youth Commissioner, District Exec members, the Appointment Committee and the new Awards Committee all work tirelessly behind the scenes to make the District operate successfully. In particular, we welcome Mark Harris as District Youth Commissioner and Chris Panton as District Network Commissioner to the District Team...

The Badge Shop and Scout Shop continued to operate on a Tuesday evening to provide uniforms, certificates and badges to the Adults and Young People in the District. This is a very useful form of revenue for us so their support is very much appreciated.

The Boyd Campsite & Activity Centre, and the Warden Team work very hard to keep the site in great condition for all of it's users. The main developments this year were the demolition of the old climbing tower, which had to be condemned and its subsequent replacement with a mobile climbing tower trailer and the refurbishment of the toilet blocks.
