The Club has made donations to local good causes including:

- 3. Donations to local individuals needing help including Children's Services and to talented young trampolinists.

The Club has provided manpower to support local events including the Penrith Sparkle run by Penrith BID.

The Club supports national events by collecting for the annual Children in Need appeal and for Marie Curie Cancer Care. A donation was given to help the people of Yorkshire following the devastating floods in November 2019.

Internationally the Club has made donations through LCIF to help with major disasters such as Typhoon Hagibis and the Australian Bushfires.

The Club supports elderly local residents by making presentations to people celebrating their 100th birthdays.
