Structure, Governance and management

The method of appointment of PCCMembers is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCc.

Objectives and Activities

Guisborough Parochial Church Council (PCC) has the responsibility of co-operating with the Rector, The Revd. Alison Phillipson in promoting, in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for St Nicholas Church and the Church Hall.

Church Attendance

There are 294 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll, 24 of who are not resident within the parish. The average weekly attendance across all services is 205 adults and 25 children. This number is increased at Festivals. This does not include Funerals, Baptisms, Marriages, Messy Church or Morning Prayer. There are also 85 home/house communions per month

PCC Secretary's Report

The PCCas at December 2019 consisted of 24 members, by law including the Rector as Chair, two Churchwardens and five ex-officio members by virtue of their election to the Deanery Synod. The remainder were elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting normally for a period of three years or through eo-option to the Committee. The number of members to be elected for three years is as determined by the previous year's APCM; for election in 2019, the number had been five.

The PCC met 7 times during 2018 (6 scheduled meetings, not including the APCM, and 1 extraordinary meetings). The PCC is required to report annually on the parish's finances, its fabric, the current Electoral Roll and the Deanery Synod and these reports will be found within this report.

Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011, together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value. The financial statements include all transactions, assets, and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body nor those that are informal gatherings of Church members.

Funds

Endowment funds are funds, the capital of which must be maintained; only income arising from investment of the endowment may be used either as restricted or unrestricted depending upon the purpose for which the endowment was established.

Restricted funds represent a) income from trusts or endowments which may be expended only on those restricted objects provided in the terms of the trust or bequest, b) donations or grants received for a specific object or invited by the PCC for a specific object, and c) funds set aside and designated by the PCC for a purpose, but which the PCC can reallocate if that purpose no exists.

Unrestricted funds are general funds which can be used for PCC ordinary purposes.

The PCC considers it sound financial management to maintain reserves of between 25% and 33% of annual turnover. This implies that general reserves of between £40,000 and £52,800 are required in respect of the proposed budgeted expenditure for 2020. General Reserves at 31 December 2019 are marginally within this range, standing at £42,735.

Incoming Resources

- Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC.
- Planned giving receivable under covenant is recognised only when received.
- Income tax recoverable on covenant or gift aid donations is recognised when the income is recognised.
- Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement and the amount due.
- · Dividends are accounted for when receivable, interest is accrued.
- All other income is recognised when it is receivable.
- All incoming resources (e.g. funds raised by the bazaar, craft fair and similar events, sales of books and magazines) are accounted for gross.

Other ordinary income

Rental income from the letting of church premises is recognised when the rental is due.

Financial Statements of the PCC for the year ending 31 December 2019

Income from investments

Dividends and interest are accounted for when receivable. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains and losses are recognised when investments are sold.

Unrealised gains and losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December.

Resources Used

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding obligation on the PCC.

Activities directly relating to the work of the Church

The diocesan Freewill Offering is accounted for when payable. Any Freewill Offering unpaid at 31 December is provided for in these accounts as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the Balance Sheet. Amounts received specifically for mission are dealt with as restricted funds. All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from the accounts by section 96(2) (a) of the Charities Act 1993.

No value is placed on movable church furnishings held by the churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal since the PCC considers this to be inalienable property. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or benefice buildings and movable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off as expenditure in the SOFA and separately disclosed.

Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December 2019.

Current assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectible.

Short term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church of England Funds or at the bank.

Treasurer's Report 2019

As the church has continued to move forward and extend our ministry in the community, we have continued to develop new activities, initiatives, and events, such as the Jesus and Me (JAM) session for children during the Sunday 9.30 a.m. service, the Graham Kendrick concert, Music Day, and various other community events.

Our vestry area has been remodelled and fitted out to not only provide better storage facilities, but also can now be used as a meeting room with modern presentation facilities, thanks to successful Key Fund grant applications by our young people.

The total funds for the Church decreased by £15,875 in 2019, with the general fund decreasing by £8,039 in 2019, despite unrealised profits on the general fund investments of £4,903 (compared to a general fund deficit of £1 0,455 in 2018, including unrealised losses on the general fund investments of £399).

In 2019 there were total unrealised profits on investments of £13,353 (this compares to a total unrealised loss on investments in 2018 of £1,087), however there continues to be much fluctuation and uncertainty in the financial and stock markets.

At the end of 2018 our heating and lighting provider went into administration, which resulted in our costs for both the Church and the Parish Hall increasing significantly in 2019.

The Parish's Freewill Offering (the amount that the Church paid to the Diocese) in 2019 has been maintained for 2020.

Following further roof lead thefts in 2019, resulting in our insured limit for lead theft being fast approached, the PCC decided to invest in an approved roof alarm system. This not only makes the theft of lead from the roof less likely and helps protect the fabric of the building, but also reduced our insurance premium while providing unlimited lead theft cover.

General Fund Planned Giving (and associated tax recovery) has continued to decline in 2019. It is essential, if we are to continue to develop our church and extend the outreach of our church's ministry, that we seek to increase giving, by encouraging generosity of our existing and future church members.

In addition, we continue to look to increase our tax recovery on planned giving and donations.

Did you know that if you are a tax payer and sign a Gift-Aid declaration, the PCC as a registered charity can recover the amount of tax you have paid on your giving and donations (currently 25p for every £1 given in this way), and all at no extra cost to you?

I would therefore encourage anybody who is a taxpayer, and does not currently Gift Aid their giving, to consider signing a Gift-Aiding declaration. To learn more about this please have a word with myself or John Carr our Gift Aid Officer.

You can give directly from your bank account, using bankers standing orders, (which is the most convenient way of giving), or alternatively you can request your own set of weekly giving envelopes.

There are Gift-Aid envelopes in the pews (pink envelopes), and I would encourage any tax paying members of the congregation who have not yet signed a Gift-Aid declaration, to use them whenever possible until you have signed a Gift Aid declaration.

Fundraising events have been many and varied in 2019, resulting in total fundraising activities for the general fund generating over £18,500 net. The Christmas Fayre continues to be our main source of general fundraising from a single event, raising over £8,600 in 2019.

Other fundraising took place during the year including regular coffee mornings, monthly Craft Fairs, Beer Festival, Burns Night, Klondike, Christmas Wreath Festival, Graham Kendrick concert, and numerous other events.

The PCC considers it sound financial management to maintain reserves of between 25% and 33% of annual turnover. This implies that general reserves of between £40,000 and £52,800 are required in respect of the proposed budgeted expenditure for 2020. General Reserves at 31 December 2019 are marginally within this range, standing at £42,735.

We continue to explore opportunities and options for re-ordering of the church, acknowledging that any agreed re-ordering will come at a cost that general reserves will not cover. Therefore, we will be seeking other means of funding works, including investigating various grant funding opportunities and specific fundraising events.

I would like to thank all those who assist with the weekly Gift Aid Envelopes and weekly cash counts, and those who have helped with the management and accounting of income and expenditure during the year, both in the Church and at the numerous events, concerts, and fund-raising activities. Without your help the church would have undoubtedly struggled and not been as successful and vibrant as it has been.

I would also like to thank John Carr for all his work as Gift Aid Officer in recovering the tax on gift aided giving from HMRC.

Finally, many thanks to all those who support this Church, both financially (planned givers, tax efficient givers, those using Gift-Aid envelopes, and all those who put into the plate or give using bankers standing orders), and with their time, skills, and talents. A sincere thank you all for giving so generously in order that we can continue to maintain this beautiful and historic building and look to expand the ministry of our Church.
