Year ended 31 December 2019

The Trustees present their Annual report for the year ended 31 December 2019.

Objects

The purpose of the All Saints Community Project Trust is to empower the local community, in conjunction with the Christian Mission of St Paul with All Saints Church and the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, to help improve fundamental issues such as education, safety, increased employment, life skills and lower crime.

The Project shall work in partnership with voluntary and statutory agencies as well as the community to identify areas of concern and felt needs and to positively address these.

The project shall uphold equal opportunity values and strive to work with and empower people of all ages, ethnic background, faith or disability.

In November 2016 the Trust successfully converted to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).

Activities in the year

From January 2018, a new project lead started and took over the day to day running of the project and applying for funding to expand our existing work and start some new exciting projects.

The Project runs a variety of social activities for the local community, which are highly valued and well supported.

- Lunch Club has a steady number of attendees, providing a low cost 2 course meal and the opportunity, for those over 45, to meet socially.
- Have A Go weekly craft sessions, a Quilting Group and weekly coffee mornings, all take place along with the monthly Walking Group and the Gardening Project.

The Magpie Café.

The Café continues to support the work of the project and provide a community focus and meeting space. We have made improvements to the till systems and now have a touch screen computer system with pictures which has allowed the café to

become more accessible to our volunteers who can now work every element of their role thereby massively improving their skills base.

Depression & Anxiety Group

The group has continued to meet fortnightly and we have a regular membership of 8 – 10 people.

- · Fortnightly meetings continue which has found the members open up and talk emotively about their life experiences, feelings and concerns.
- · Friendships have been forged, which has reduced feelings of isolation and provides support outside of the group.
- · Group activities range from self-help, art, nature, positive thinking, healthy eating, quizzes, team building, promoting Mental Health awareness weeks etc.

School Holiday Club.

We now run a school holiday club that includes a free hot and healthy meal. We hope to go someway in tackling the increasing problem of school holiday hunger in the Chatham area. The group also offers a chance for parents to do fun activities with their child that are free of charge including arts and crafts, games and baking.

Community Group Coordinator

We now have a member of staff dedicated to our community groups, there is something going on in the Magpie everyday between 10 and 12, this helps with tackling social isolation. People from the local area come along and meet new people or learn a new skill. Our clients say its nice to know they have somewhere to go and see people everyday.

Christmas Hampers

We provided over 100 Christmas food hampers including everything needed for a Christmas dinner and gifts for children. We worked with other organisations in the community and accepted referrals for those who were struggling during the festive period.

The REAP Project

Medway REAP (Restoration Empowerment Action Purpose) is a partnership project designed to improve the circumstances of families or individuals who are experiencing hardship. The project partners include Medway Foodbank, Home Start, Medway Residential Services (MRS), Medway Engagement Group And Network (MEGAN), The Strood Community Project and All Saints Community Project.

The REAP project provides support in two main ways:

- practical support through Food Bank vouchers and utility payments.
- advice and action planning for benefits, housing and debt.

The partnership has continues to move from strength to strength, with a positive open and hardworking team committed to helping the people of Medway through times of crisis.

We intend to reapply to the National Lottery for funding in the hope to continue this project for many years to come.

Sam's Place

Sam's Place After School Club offers affordable childcare for local working parents and nearly 30 children attend each evening.

Restricted Funds

This year we moved unspent funds from a grant from the people's health fund which had funded a project called "time to talk", over to our depression and anxiety group. This was agreed by the original funders as the depression and anxiety group tied into the aims of the original grant.

The magpie growers were unfortunately closed down during this financial year, it was no longer financially viable due to lack of interest from volunteers. The deficit was covered by unrestricted funds.

The deficit from the First Byte computer Centre was also covered by unrestricted funds, this won't be an ongoing problem as we have secured a new funding source for this going forward into 2020.

The 49 regular volunteers are very important to the Project and are greatly valued.

Ongoing support from the Diocese and the PCC of St Paul with All Saints has been essential to enable the Trust to continue its work.

The Trust continues to support the residents of two of the four poorest Wards in the Medway area. We continue to plan for the future believing in the crucial and immensely important work we are engaged in, supporting the poorest in our community and faithfully "working to enrich lives and build HOPE for a better FUTURE, through the JOY and LOVE of JESUS".

Financial Review

Income for the year was £184,760 (2018: £148,910),

Expenditure was £179,225 (2018: £119,276). Net incoming movement in funds for the year was £5,535 (2018: £29,634 incoming).

The balance of funds remaining at the end of the year was £81,356 and grants and new income streams would be needed as we seek to maintain the level of support to local people.

The general fund at the end of the year stood at £11,810. The focus in 2020 will be to maintain income streams and develop a platform for the future direction of the Trust.

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Accounting basis

1.2 Funds

The Community project funds fall into two categories, those restricted to specific projects and those for general purposes.

Restricted Funds are those largely funded by specific grants from third parties these grants may only be expended in these areas. A full desciption of the purpos of each fund is given in the Annual Report.

Other Funds included as Designated Funds are for activities and groups set up by the All Saints Community Project Trust.

Unrestricted funds comprise of the General Funds, Magpie Centre Fund and the Magpie Café.
