# Organisational structure

The Society was formed by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act (1932), as amended, and is governed by the RSPCA Acts and Rules of the Society.

The Society is managed by an elected Council, who, subject to the rules, control the affairs, funds, property and proceedings of the Society. They are assisted in the administration of the Society by a central organisation, headquarters and branches.

The Branch is governed by a committee, which consists of trustees of the Branch (at least seven and not more than fourteen eligible Branch members elected at the Annual General Meeting held in June under normal circumstances; plus up to three co-opted committee members who may be, but need not be Branch members). The trustees have a collective responsibility for the management of the Branch and its funds. Long-standing volunteers who have already proven their reliability and commitment to the Branch and its cause are greatly encouraged to join the team of trustees.

The Branch also welcomes enquiries about trusteeship from members of the public. To ensure suitability, candidates are interviewed by an existing trustee before being invited to attend a committee meeting; they must also provide the details of a referee to whom the Secretary can apply for a reference. If successful, the candidate serves a six month probationary period and undergoes a short training course provided by the Branch Support Specialist (employed by the national Society) before official co-option or election (if eligible) onto the committee.

## **Objects and public benefit statement**

The Branch is an unincorporated charitable association and a separately registered branch of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. With no paid member of staff it relies entirely on volunteers to carry out its direct animal welfare work in the areas of Macclesfield, South East Cheshire & Buxton.

The objects of the Branch are to promote the work and objects of the Society – to promote kindness and to prevent or suppress cruelty to animals by all lawful means – with particular reference to the area of the Branch, in accordance with the policies of the Society.

The trustees meet regularly and review the outcomes and achievements of our objectives to ensure we remain focused on our charitable aims and continue to deliver benefits to the public. This influences future developments and the planning of our activities for the year and in doing so shows compliance with the duty under the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission.

## Advancement of animal welfare

Our animal welfare work, whilst local in nature, benefits society at large and aims to help people in need with the care of their animals.

Under the Charities Act 2011 the advancement of animal welfare is recognised as a distinct statutory charitable purpose. This legislation and the Animal Welfare Act of 2011 indicate an acceptance by society that treating living creatures with compassion has a moral benefit for the public as a whole. While this benefit is clear, it is sometimes difficult to quantify and must be balanced against any detriment.

The next section of this report highlights the Branch's main activities and demonstrates the benefit provided to the public. All our charitable activities, as described in more detail in the following pages of this report, focus on promoting kindness and preventing or suppressing cruelty to animals and are undertaken to further these purposes for the public benefit.

# Charitable activities pursued for the public benefit

We support our local Inspectors by taking in, free of charge, mistreated or abandoned animals, including pets whose owners suffer ill health or financial difficulties or pass away. The Society's Inspectorate rescues animals in distress and enforces laws against the cruel mistreatment of animals in England and Wales by bringing prosecutions. This work is key to the prevention or suppression of cruelty, part of the RSPCA objectives, and promotes humane sentiments towards animals, with moral benefits to humankind as a whole.

We provide subsidised veterinary treatment for animals which are sick or injured and belong to people on low disposable income. This work benefits those on means tested benefits by giving them financial help to obtain care for companion animals in need of veterinary treatment. We provide subsidised neutering and microchipping of companion animals for those in the Branch area on low disposable incomes. This work helps to control dog and cat populations through neutering and benefits those on means tested benefits by giving them financial help to neuter and microchip companion animals, thereby promoting responsible pet ownership.

Animals in our care receive veterinary treatment, vaccination, neutering, and microchipping and are assessed for rehoming. This work helps to control the incidence and spread of disease and suffering through vaccination and neutering.

We rehome animals in need at low cost to people willing and able to have a companion animal. Whilst we recognise that companion animals provide measurable benefits to people's physical and mental health, we consider the provision of pets as subsidiary to the main charitable aim of this service, which is to reduce animal suffering. Our policy to charge a reasonable adoption fee for animals aims to highlight the ongoing personal and financial commitment of pet ownership. It would not be in the best interests of animals, and therefore would fall outside our objectives, to rehome to those who could not afford them.

We respond to enquiries from the public locally who are seeking advice about animals in need. Where we are able to we also offer free advice.

Voluntary opportunities exist for those who wish to support our work, including trusteeship, pre-adoption home visiting, fostering and fundraising. This benefits local people by providing the possibility of doing work that is compassionate and rewarding.

## **Related Parties**

There have been no related party transactions for the period 1st January 2019 to 31st December 2019.

## <u>Risk Analysis</u>

The trustees realize that the money spent must be kept under control and a close watch has been kept on the level of expenses incurred throughout the year. A financial update is presented to the Trustees monthly, the Trustees forward plan each financial year and adjust the planning if there are significant changes in circumstances. In addition, the Branch has developed policies and procedures for volunteers to follow in relation to solitary working, secure transfer of information and volunteering during the coronavirus pandemic.

# **Reserves Policy**

The trustees hope to maintain at least 6 months monetary reserves equating to approximately £32000 to ensure the continuation of its services through a temporary period of hardship should one occur (such as a lack of volunteers to raise funds, influx of animals needing on-going/complex veterinary treatment, unforeseen local and national emergencies etc.), whilst a contingency plan is developed.

## **Investment Policy**

The Branch does not hold any investment products.

## Financial Review

The Branch started the year with  $\pm$ 130899 in the bank and ended the year with a balance of  $\pm$ 102739.

This is before adjustment for debtors and creditors.

The generated funds at £38969 was £1950 more than those for 2018.

In addition there were unexpected legacies of £14731.

The total expenditure is £89878, which is £26140 more than in 2018.

Our main expenses remain boarding costs and veterinary fees. Our boarding costs were £4609 more than in 2018. Both our veterinary fees and veterinary assistance fees were more than in 2018. The veterinary fees were £435 more. The veterinary assistance fees were £4609 more reflecting more help given to pet owners to fund treatment for their animals.

Most animals now come through to the Branch via Greater Manchester Animal Hospital where neutering is usually carried out and initial veterinary treatment given.

The bank interest received was more than in 2018 as a result of a healthier bank balance.

The level of income from adoption fees was increased by £4112. Our regular donors Animal Angels scheme and general donations decreased, as did the donations received via PayPal.

Gift aid is claimed on all relevant donations every two years.

As has been well-publicised by the national Society, there was little improvement during the year relating to animal welfare in terms of levels of abuse and neglect.

# Statement of Trustees Responsibilities

Under the Charities Act 2011, the trustees are required to prepare a statement of accounts for each financial year, which gives a true and fair view of the charity's income and expenditure for the year and of its state of affairs at the end of the year. In preparing the statement, the trustees are required to:

State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements
prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its operations

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the charity, and enable the Trustees to ensure that any statement of account prepared by them complies with the Charities Act 2011.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention or detection of fraud or other irregularities.

# Summary of the main activities and achievements

In terms of Branch animals from the start of 2019 we have kept a careful eye on the number of animals taken in to preserve our financial position. The number of animals taken in is shown in the table below

Please note that while every care is taken to ensure that the figures provided are as accurate as possible, small anomalies can occur owing to the administrative process. If/when this does happen the difference is only minor.

During the year we rehomed 45 dogs, 1 was transferred to another branch and unfortunately 5 were put to sleep on veterinary advice. 66 cats were rehomed, 2 were put to sleep on veterinary advice. 16 rabbits were rehomed. 21 other animals were rehomed.

A total of 10 animals were returned to the Branch after rehoming by their adopters.

There is still a problem with escalating rabbit numbers and not all branches offer a rehoming service for this species.

At the year end we were caring for 6 dogs, 15 cats, 14 rabbits and 6 other animals, a total of 41.

The efforts of our rehoming coordinators are commendable.

9 rehomed dogs, 22 rehomed cats and 15 rehomed rabbits were microchipped.

Although in our welfare work we did not hold any microchipping events during the year we helped the owners of 23 cats, 3 dogs and 8 rabbits with the cost of microchipping their pets.

22 rehomed dogs, 13 rehomed cats and 13 rehomed rabbits were neutered in the period.

In addition we helped the owners of 20 cats, 21 dogs and 9 rabbits, total 50 animals, fund the cost of neutering their animals. We helped with the cost of veterinary fees for 36 cats, 47 dogs and 3 miscellaneous animals, a total of 86. Beside these cases our volunteer dealt with many more cases where people asked for advice or support. These did not involve the branch in any financial outlay.

We operate a **trap**, **neuter release scheme** for feral cats. Our volunteer trapped neutered and released a total of 21 feral cats. Not only does this include the stereotypical feral cat it also includes community cats which are non-feral but nonetheless unowned.

# **Fundraising**

In addition to the income from the network of static boxes and street and store collections and income from text giving we had a presence at a couple of Macclesfield Treacle market stalls, at the Rotary Club Summer Fair and Dickensian Market in Buxton and ran a number of tombolas and pub quizzes. We also held two successful Dog Shows and sold Christmas cards.

We were again chosen by Waitrose as one of their community matters charity and a big thank you to everyone who put their token in our box.

Our wonderful supporters continue to help us. They did runs, made cards, sold cakes, organised quizzes, did sponsored walks, donated money received in lieu of birthday presents, donated to wear Christmas jumpers, held an online raffle, donated from an animal church service and sold firewood, all to raise funds for us.

Thank you so much.

We would usually list all our donors to say thank you but are not able to do so to comply with Data Protection Regulations. We have also received a number of anonymous donations.

Thank you to everyone.

Our supporters continue to donate food. The donation of food is a vital help to us.

We received donations in the memory of loved ones. Thank you for thinking of us at this very sad time in your lives.

As well as our website we are now using our Facebook page and twitter more widely to keep all of our followers informed of upcoming events.

Finally we would like to thank each and every one of our supporters, fosterers and volunteers whose commitment and efforts mean that we are able to continue to help and love needy animals that come into our care. We couldn't do it without you.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
