TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2020

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31st March 2020.

Objectives and Activities

The Charity's object is to provide accommodation for persons of limited means who are inhabitants of the County of Devon, with a preference for such persons who are inhabitants of the parish of Bishops Tawton.

The Charity currently achieves its object by renting out the Law Memorial Houses in Bishops Tawton. These are almshouses.

In carrying out the Charity's object, the Trustees have regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit. The Charity is a member of the Almshouse Association, and the Trustees consult the guidance of that Association as and when appropriate.

Achievements

One Trustee retired at the Annual General Meeting in October 2019, namely Mrs Jill Waldron, who had been our longest serving Trustee. A new Trustee, Mr Phil Bates, has been recruited to replace her with effect from the 15th January 2020. The Trustees are now David Burgess (Chairman), Ingrid Vain, Sue Hilsdon, June Courcha, Phil Bates and Richard Vain (Treasurer/Secretary). North Devon Homes continues to act as our Managing Agent. Sadly, their long-standing representative with us, Mr Miles Sellick, passed away suddenly in June 2019. We very much miss his valuable advice and contribution to the almshouses, and are seeking to raise a suitable memorial to him on the almshouses site. He has been ably succeeded by Ms Lindsey Eastman.

The Law Memorial Houses continues to provide accommodation for 12 people in 4 single flats and 4 double maisonettes. The accommodation has been fully occupied throughout the year, apart from a few weeks vacancy resulting from a change of resident in one of the flats.

The Charity has continued to pay careful attention to the maintenance of the property and its grounds. It is a very attractive listed Victorian structure set in mature gardens and overlooking the valley of the River Taw. Works in the past year have included a complete refurbishment of the rear yard and adjoining paths by local contractors Mark Yeo & Sons Ltd (photos of this work were published in the Almshouse Association's magazine); various minor items brought to light by our health & safety inspections; and preparing specifications and seeking tenders for forthcoming extensive repairs and maintenance to the pointing and masonry of the building and boundary walls. We have also set in motion the early stages of planning the improvement of the Trustees' Meeting Room.

The gardens continued to be very well kept by our gardener, Matt Adams, and by the residents.

We have updated and extended our Safeguarding Policy and introduced a policy for what we should be doing when residents are no longer capable of independent living.

Achievements (contd.)

The 'weekly maintenance charge' (or rent) continued to be based on local rates of Housing Benefit.

We continued to make reduction in the Charity's liability for the outstanding capital loan in the course of the year.

The Charity's Risk Assessment was updated following an *ad hoc* inspection of the property exterior and grounds by the Trustees. Various works were set in train in consequence of this.

Law Scholarship Trust: No grants have been made during the course of this year, and no approach has been made to us for financial assistance. Towards the end of this year lockdown was imposed because of the Coronavirus outbreak, and this led us to enquire of the local primary school whether any digital equipment could be supplied to assist needy children with their on-line schooling, but as yet this has been taken no further by the school. The local pre-school, however, has told us of their need to provide furnishings and equipment for their new premises, and we have asked them to supply further details – this line of enquiry is continuing.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have overall responsibility for securing the efficient and effective administration of the charity and its resources. Accordingly, the Trustees regard proper control of the charity's finances as being of utmost importance.

The Trustees are mindful of the need to ensure that the assets of the Trust are kept in good and proper repair and order, improved when occasion arises and safeguarded against unexpected occurrence and liabilities. The Trustees are therefore required to make provision for future unexpected or exceptional expenses which cannot readily be covered by the income of a single year. Provision also has to be made to ensure the smooth administration of current expenditure.

With the foregoing in mind, the Trustees seek to maintain adequate reserves of surplus funds to ensure that they able to meet the demands of an uncertain future.

The following are some of the matters the Trustees have taken into account in determining the current level of reserves. This is by way of illustration only and not intended to be a full and exclusive list.

- Funding of large repairs or other works of a cyclical nature (eg new roof)
- Funding of extraordinary or emergency repairs or other works.
- Temporary rehousing of residents during such works.
- Creating a contingency fund to meet possible unexpected increases in budgeted items.
- Covering the possible loss of income from prolonged vacancies.
- Covering unexpected liabilities or obligations, eg legal costs
- Covering temporary inadequacy of funds in the current account.

Reserves Policy (contd.)

For the current year the Trustees have decided to maintain Reserves in the range £55,000 - £75,000.

If the Reserves are reduced by expenditure from them for any purpose, the Trustees will as soon as practicable thereafter review the Reserves Policy and determine what steps, if any, need to be taken concerning the level of Reserves.

This Policy is to be reviewed from time to time during the year, and in particular as soon as the insurance value of the buildings is received.

Structure, Governance & Management

The Law Memorial Houses is a registered charity created in the 19th century, and now governed by the Scheme document dated 6th October 1961, as amended on 9th February 1993. It is an unincorporated association.

The Charity is run by a Board of Trustees.

New Trustees are appointed by resolution of the Trustees at a special meeting.

One Trustee received travel expenses of £36 for attending an AHA trust seminar.

The Trustees declare that they have approved the Trustees' Report above.
