## **Objectives and activities**

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

- 1. The Objects of the Charity are the provision and maintenance of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of St Briavels and Hewelsfield, who are its beneficiaries, without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, including use for:
  - a) meetings, lectures and classes, and
  - b) other forms of recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants.
- 2. The land identified in the schedules to the Charity Commission scheme must be retained by the trustees for use for the objects of the charity.

The Trustees have had due regard for the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

The Assembly Rooms are run as a charitable limited company, entirely by unpaid local volunteers, on behalf of the beneficiaries, the parishioners of St. Briavels and Hewelsfield.

that trustees have had regard to After several years of redevelopment, 2019 (as the four previous years) the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

continued the consolidation of the uses of the Halls, with total income almost unchanged from the previous three years. The final stage of redevelopment, the refurbishment of the 1856 Reading Room, was again delayed by the dispute with the neighbouring Townsend Cottages referred to below.

As in previous years, the building was used by many local organisations and individuals during the year, including regular events and meetings such as the People's Choir, table tennis club, yoga, pilates, the art group, parent and toddler playtime, language tuition, shows, concerts and quiz nights. The hall is also used for parish council meetings and private functions and as the election polling station for the parish. The cafe, which opens on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, continued to be a major local facility offering free wi-fi and attended by a mobile hairdresser.

The Trustees continued to work under professional guidance to resolve ownership and rights of way disputes with neighbouring properties. The proceedings already issued by the charity in respect of Townsend Cottages were progressed during the year. Several attempts were made to set a trial date towards the end of the year, which was eventually set for March 2020. The matter was settled out of court before the trial, with a very satisfactory outcome which preserved all of the charity's ownership and rights. The facts surrounding this case have been shared with the Commission in several exchanges in the summer of 2020.

A second (very long-running) dispute, with the Charles Lord Denton Almshouses charity on the other side of the Halls, took a new turn: the Almshouses trustees established a CIO in February 2019 and issued proceedings against the charity in November 2019. Mediation required by the Court failed in the summer of 2020 and the matter is on-going. This

matter has been the subject of a Serious Incident Report to the Commission.

There are no further serious issues to report.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

As indicated above, 2019 was a year in which the use of the redeveloped Rooms was consolidated. Income was slightly lower (by 6%) at £25,637, but an almost 25% drop in costs resulted in a substantial improvement in net income from £524 to £5,343. Reserves remained strong: cash at the bank rose from £17,496 the previous year to £21,418.

The Board consider this financial strength to be an important foundation for the remaining big challenge of the comprehensive redevelopment of the Rooms: the restoration of the Reading Room. The planning and fundraising for this has been delayed for some three years by the dispute with Townsend Cottages referred to above. Planning will resume once the other dispute noted above, with the Almshouses charity, has been resolved.

The Charity's policy is to retain a reserve to cover the working capital required by the charity over a minimum 3-month period. However, previous capital works have been largely grant-funded, whereas the final phase of redevelopment (the major Reading Rooms project) is expected to need significant input from the Charity itself. Accordingly reserves continue to be increased in preparation for that phase.

#### 1. General Information

The Charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is East Street, St Briavels, Lydney, Gloucestershire, GL15 6TG

#### 2 Statement of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland, the statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (Charities SORP (FRS102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

#### 3 Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The Financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The Financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the entity

#### **Going Concern**

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue

#### **Disclosure Exemptions**

The entity satisfies the criteria of being a qualifying entity as defined in FRS 102. As such advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemptions available under paragraph 1.12 of FRS 102:

- (a) no cash flow statement has been presented for the company
- (b) disclosures in respect of financial instruments have not been presented

#### Judgements and Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affects the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### **Fund Accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the directors for particular future projects or commitments

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

#### **Incoming Resources**

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reasonably measured. the following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.

legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.

income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

#### **Resources Expended**

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.

expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.

other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

#### **Tangible Assets**

Tangible assets are recorded at cost, and are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £500. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation.

#### Depreciation

Buildings are depreciated at £10 per annum; fixtures and fittings are depreciated at 10% of original cost per annum.

#### Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost or market value.

#### **Financial Instruments**

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

#### 4 Limited by guarantee

The St. Briavels Assembly Rooms Limited is a company limited by guarantee and accordingly does not have a share capital. Every member promises, if the company is dissolved while he or she remains a member or within one year afterwards, to pay up to £1 towards the cost of dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the charity while he or she was a member.
