Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	As at 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2019 the clubs cash position remained strong with closing current account balance of £13,164, cash in transit of £2,451 plus reserves of £10,558, so total cash of £26,172. Total income of £43,035 was received in the year of which membership income and events contributed £36,099. Total costs of £41,265 were incurred including payments to Brighton Sailing Club for rent of club facilities £14,088 and pool hire £3,392. In addition, the SLSGB membership cost were £4,416 plus members events and course costs £6,255. During the year the club purchased equipment to the value of £2,732.
