

- 3. Minutes of the last meeting were approved Proposed Richard Towers 2nd Pat Smithson
- 4. Tellers Not required
- 5. Election of Church Wardens:- Alison Rohatynskj and Neil Whitaker will serve as Church Wardens for a third year. Brian Goddard as deputy Church Warden.
- 6. Bishops Visitations to be confirmed

Annual Parochial Church Meeting

There was no additional Treasurers Report as Deborah was unwell. The accounts having been approved by the PCC and audited by Bob Smith were accepted Proposed by Pat Smith 2nd Neil Whitaker.

Church Wardens: Alison Rohatynskj and Neil Whitaker are willing to continue and Brian Goddard as deputy.

Project 200+ – David Griffiths thanked the many people at different levels for their help with this project. Brian Goddard has met with the representative of the Lottery Fund and we await a decision. Should we be successful it could take up to six months before any monies are forthcoming. Dependent on the sum of money we have available by 5th April 2019 a decision will be taken with the architect as to what we will be able to do during this summer. David Griffiths invited the meeting to look at the

revised plans shown on the notice board and to give him any feedback.

Electoral Roll- David Griffiths thanked Pat Smith for her hard work on this. In 2018 there were 93 on the electoral roll 7 of whom were non residents. In 2019 there are 87 on the electoral roll with 5 being non residents.

Safeguarding: Deborah Thorley is in charge of this so no details were given.

Welcomers/Sides People- Thanks were given to those on the rota and David Griffiths asked if anyone would be willing to serve as welcome. Jane volunteed for the role. Proposed Pat Smithson 2nd Pat Smith

Bell Ringers: Thanks were given to all concerned and David asked for volunteers.

Brass Cleaners: Thanks were given for their work and volunteers were asked for.

Cameo: All OK.

Childrens Workshop: Louise asked for volunteers to help with the older group. Also it would be good should we have more children in church.

Choir: The choir has grown steadily. From April Chris Brooke will take over playing the organ on the 3rd Sunday of the month.

2019 Reports and Accounts for the Parochial Church Council of St James the Great, Silsden

St James' PCC has the responsibility of cooperating with the incumbent, the Reverend David Griffiths, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. The PCC is also specifically responsible for the maintenance of the church and hall of St James the Great, Silsden.

Incumbent's Report

PRAYER

Making prayer, for each of us, a central and natural conversation with God.

Prayer is one of our vision priorities that we want to encourage and deepen as a church and as individuals.

Prayer group - Our church prayer group is **OPEN TO ALL** and meets monthly on the 4th WEDNESDAY of the month @ Joyce Parkers home - 18, Hillcrest Avenue under the leadership of Pat Smith. We have a Prayer Chain so please use it - contact details in the church magazine. Please use the prayer board at the front of church near the votive candle stand - use these to enhance and encourage your prayers or ask for the prayers of others. We hope to extend prayer by starting other prayer groups - triplets - that can meet at mutually convenient times.

Post Service Prayer Team - This has been launched with 2 people each 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sunday being available to offer help with a listening ear and prayers for anyone after the 10.30am service.

Thank you to this prayer group team and Pat who leads prayer initiatives for our church.

TEACHING

Knowing and understanding the Bible and learning about our faith from each other.

Encouraging greater confidence as Christians is one of our vision priorities that we want to encourage and deepen as a church and as individuals.

Workshops - are continuing to hand down wisdom and faith to our young people and inform our leaders too as they interact and teach our 'younger uns' - thank you. It is encouraging that younger leaders such as Connor are leading some of the Workshop Seniors sessions. The Workshops student numbers have dropped off markedly and this is concerning and is going to be addressed in our vision strategy for 2020.

Home Groups - continue to enhance our church life and faith journey greatly and it has been a joy to learn of people trying new things they have never done before. We are very grateful to the leaders and hosts of the Home Groups for their service to us. The number of groups has been 2 this last year led by Neil and John, Val and Brian. They are full and we need leaders to begin 2 more which we pray will be needed as we see people respond to Jesus through our Alpha courses.

Sunday Gathering - this has been running now for 3.5 years and Val and Brian and home group members have joined the leading of this service. We are seeing new, younger people coming which is exciting but we are not retaining them as we would wish to so more work is needed. Thanks to the set up crews, breakfast, band, Welcomers and Steve and Connor for all the significant amounts of time they are giving to this venture. We want to extend The Gathering to weekly and are currently exploring how this might be done in the autumn of 2020.

Alpha - We had our first ALPHA Course this year [2019] - it was small but was very encouraging as we saw people touched by God and we were too! We have just finished our 2nd course and are running a 3rd in autumn of this [2020] year. Thanks to Neil, Alison, Brian and Jayne and all other helpers.

PROPHETIC CHALLENGE

Speaking out against injustice and acting to build God's Kingdom.

Prophetic action and challenge is one of our vision priorities that we want to encourage and deepen as a church and as individuals.

Locally we continue to be involved with supporting the **food bank** at the Salvation Army in Keighley. Our local Co-Op store sends its redundant fresh food and donated items to the Army via our church on Thursdays.

Plastic - one of our vision objectives is environmental as we try to reduce our negative impact on the environment - we thank Caroline Whitaker for all her work in this area and have been really encouraged by the recent [2020] Pop Up Re-fill Shop that is being hosted by the Methodist Church and financed by The Churches Together in Silsden. We are using solid bar soap and have reduced our use of plastic laminated posters on our advertising boards - it does not look so good but, after my Corfu holiday lying on a plastic infested beach, it is worth it - small though the step is!

'PROJECT 200 +' - please see Brian's report. A big thank you to Brian and Derek who are the main design group and Grant Fund Raising Mission Group members, relating to Overton Architects and the grant making trusts.

The Grant Fund Raising side is a little frustrating as things are progressing slowly. We have a £97,000 request in to The National Lottery - please pray for favour with the committees it still has to go through.

We have managed to put in the wheel chair access ramp and the bi-fold doors. The doors have opened the room wonderfully as Silsden has come inside and we are on show outside - these features will be enhanced further in the summer.

Also a thank you to the Events Fund Raising Mission Group which has been very successful putting on 4 very successful events and with another 5 events in the planning. So far having raised nearly £7,000.

'PROJECT 300 +' - having served us and our community for 300 years our church building also needs modernising for the next 300 years and we are planning to do this but when do not know.

All of the above is enabled by you all, by the building, by your financial giving, by our diocesan crew, and so much more – but definitely by the grace of God.

The Friends of Silsden Park has come from this initiative and 4 members of the Silsden churches are on this community group's committee and they are an active and creative group for which we are grateful with many enhancements to our park.

Silsden Green Places are doing a great job and have taken over the hanging basket initiative begun by Silsden's Grand July.

Silsden Gala Committee. - There is only David on this committee at the moment and another from one of the churches would be great. This successful group organises the Christmas Market, supports the fire works at the Hive and the Gala. Thank you to all on this committee and to Steve the Chair.

It would be great to have another person on this committee from our church so if anyone is interested in joining this committee please see David.

The Gala was disappointing weather wise BUT Churches Together in Silsden won best Walking Float.

Christian Aid Committee - This committee has joined with CTIS [Churches Together in Silsden] and the two groups have joint meetings.

Friends of Silsden Town Hall and Library - This valuable community asset is now taken over from Brad Met as a community asset. 'Our' Val has got involved organising the library volunteers and other church members are staffing the library - thank you. If anymore folk can join them from our ranks please do so.

As we widen our connections as a church with our community please be prepared to share and bless others who have not yet met with Jesus.

Thank you for all your giving this last year - of yourselves, your money and your time!

TEAM BUILDING

Encouraging everyone to be part of a world-wide community of Christians, with servant hearts and on a shared adventure.

The Parochial Church Council [PCC] - team is composed of Mission Groups for Mission and Social, Fabric and Worship aspects of our church life these have not been working very well and we are in the process of reorganising these and widening their remit. Thank you to all the PCC members.

The Churches Together in Silsden - team has had a good year winning the Gala with our celebration of creation theme using the old parachute again. We have a new Chair - Barbara Ayrton, Secretary Pam Lloyd and Jayne Robinson and Treasurer Pam Lloyd. We are supporting "Who Let the Dad's Out", Contact Club, The Pop Up Refill Shop and the Dementia initiative. Thank you to Jayne who is our church rep.

The Parish Share - our part towards the running costs of the Diocese was not paid in full for 2019. We paid £42,500 towards the Share which was 80% of that requested our Share being short by £10,700. This is a mystery at the moment as we had an apparently successful appeal to increase our giving through "Looking to the Future" resulting in a theoretical 30% increase.

We will have a better understanding when the accounts are finalised.

Church Wardens - we have been served this last year by Alison and Neil and a big thank you to them. Thanks to the work of our Service Wardens we have refocused the Wardens job to be less about the day to day running of the church services and buildings, although they still are responsible for them, and more about longer term strategy and planning and this has worked very well. This has been further enhanced by Brian Goddard our Deputy Church Warden - thank you Brian.

Leadership Mission Team - has been formed to further our longer term strategy and planning its members coming from, and answerable to, the PCC. Its members are the Church Wardens, Alison and Neil, Deputy Church Warden, Brian Goddard, Susan and David. This team meet 2 weeks before the monthly PCC meetings.

A big thanks to Deborah our Administrator, to Kaye our Cleaner, to the Choir and our Musical Director Brian, the Flower, Gardening, Work Day, Brass Polishing, Welcomers, Counters, Refreshmenteers, Workshop, Service Wardens - Crews

Our church runs on all sorts of groups made up of you individuals giving your gifts back to God in service and we say a big **THANK YOU** to you all.

Financial Review 2019

Total receipts on unrestricted funds were £65749.85. Planned giving gave us £29922.05, and £8677.15 was claimed as Gift Aid from this, some donations and by the small donations scheme. £16681 came into general funds from church hall lettings. Details of all the income strands is given in the full accounts.

Total receipts on restricted funds were £44934.71, the majority of this being raised for Project 200+. We continue to receive income from a legacy for works to the churchyard.

In 2019 we paid £42500 towards the Share requested by the Diocese – this was 80% of the request. Our other major expenditure was on clergy and staff (£12061.08).

From restricted funds, we spend £50028.86 which included the works on the hall.

Full details of all expenditure can be found in the full accounts.

Reserves Policy

It is the PCC policy to hold £1,000 in the unrestricted funds at the end of the year. At the end of 2019 there was £836.50 held in the current account for unrestricted funds and £14.01 held as petty cash.

My thanks to all those people who are on the Sunday counting rota (we need more people); Susan for banking the money and to Janet for keeping track of the weekly envelopes.

Finally, my thanks to all of you – without your giving, we would not be able to continue to be a Christian presence here in Silsden.

Churchwardens' Report

2019 has seen the continued progression of Project 200+ and the further implementation of our Vision.

The new bi-fold doors in the Hall have really opened the space up and also made it more welcoming from the outside (which is really important for church buildings). We are now at the stage where we need to find a large chunk of further money to enable us to proceed with the major refurbishment of the Hall in one concentrated period of 6 months. We thank the Project 220+ delivery team – and in particular those who have put in long hours on the very demanding Lottery fund application. Please pray that we get the funding we need to finish this project.

Prayer is part of our Vision - to make prayer for each of us a central and natural conversation with God. Our church established Prayer Ministry after the 10.30 service on a Sunday and we would like to thank those who have volunteered this ministry. Any feedback that you as congregation members have on this initiative would be very much appreciated – please speak with David, Susan, Brian Goddard, or either of us.

You will know that our Vision statement calls us to show God's love to all people. A successful refurbishment of the Hall will be one part of doing that. Also in connection with this part of our Vision in Autumn 2019 our church ran, for the first time, an Alpha course, a course for people to learn, or learn more, about the Christian faith. We also learned a lot about running an Alpha

course from this - so much so that we have run another one in 2020. We will also be running Alpha in Autumn 2020 and we would earnestly invite you to sign up as a participant or helper. Alpha has been a very positive adventure for our church.

Also in 2019 several of our church congregation attended a church plant conference in Leeds and then came to meetings with Rob Taylor and Karin Shaw from the Diocesan Fresh Expressions ministry team. This has been very thought provoking as we consider how to grow St James Church in Silsden – and there will be more about this at the APCM.

Alison is stepping down as Churchwarden this time due to a number of factors including increased portfolio in her responsibilities as a manager at Airedale Hospital. She is committed to continue our journey of welcome and community engagement, ensuring St James is not just a church congregation, but a resource stretching way beyond our building, with witness and mission a 7 day role for us all the analogy of a Sunday service being our top up for the week resonates loudly). She wants to help us explore the future of Lay ministry in St James and (assuming she is elected) she will continue as Deanery Synod rep, ensuring continuation of establishing ourselves and making connections within the South Craven and Wharfedale deanery – where Bishop Toby spoke recently emphasising the need to look to the future together with creativity.

Finally, as well as saying particular thank yous to: our clergy - Susan, David and Pat; to the PCC for their work; to the Service Wardens, to the counters, to the Alpha hosting teams, and to Brian Goddard our deputy church warden; we say a big thank you to everyone who provides their time to the running and appearance of this church and its surroundings, in providing ministry and spreading God's love within our community, and to everyone for your work for our church, for your support, and for your inspiring examples of Christian faith.

Project 200+

By the end of 2019, we had raised £96,394 for Phase 2 of Project 200+ through generous donations, a wide range of events and grants from funders:

- Sir George Martin Trust
- Beatrice Laing Trust
- All Churches Trust
- Silsden Aid in Sickness
- Keighley Community Chest
- Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation (Pledge for £30,000 which will be released when we have raised the balance of the funds and are ready to go ahead with the full project.)

We are very grateful to everyone who has kindly supported the project this year. The amount given has enabled us to proceed with some key aspects of the works. Local contractor, Davric, was awarded the contract to install bi-fold doors in the Hall and lay the hard landscaping to access these doors and provide an easier, ramped, access to the main hall entrance. These works, started in the school Summer holidays, were completed during the Autumn Half Term. They have made a significant enhancement to the Community Hall and delivered immediate benefits which all users can appreciate.

Opportunity has also been taken to relocate the defibrillator which is now on the wall between Kirkgate and the Church fire escape. This location provides 24-hour access and is not subject to access restrictions whenever the Pied Piper pre-school is in session.

Fund raising events this year have been varied and well supported. They included:

- Murder Mystery Evening
- £10 challenge supported by Scouts, Guides and Silsden Primary School
- Fashion Show
- Open Garden and by popular demand, a return appearance by
- Amanda Owen, the Yorkshire Shepherdess

Many thanks to everyone involved. Your efforts raised over £9,600!

Our application to the National Lottery Community Fund is still ongoing. Final proposals were submitted in early November and now have to receive approval from the Capital Review Team, Local Review Panel and the Funding Panel if we are to receive the £97,576 for which we have applied. If this funding is granted, we should be able to proceed with:

- Conversion of the existing Scout's Store into a WC accessible from the Church
- Refurbishment of the Hall entrance lobby
- Renewal of the Hall toilets

We plan to commission the remainder of the works as our finances permit. Elements of the project still to be funded include kitchen modernisation, more efficient office and meeting room layout, double glazing throughout the hall, dedicated storage areas for main hall users and, of course, refurbishment of the main hall itself.

Safeguarding

St James Silsden has adopted the Church of England's Safeguarding policy, which is reviewed annually. We also have in place procedures for ensuring that this policy is applied in all parts of St James' work.
