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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Conference of European Rabbis (CER) has been heavily involved with assisting many communities throughout Europe, in relation to a variety of projects, including preservation of cemeteries, conversions and shechita.

Donations were made to World Jewish Congress & the CER Foundation registered in Germany, Munich to fund security cost for Jewish Communities in Europe. This has become necessary in order to combat the rise in anti-semitism.

In May 2019, the CER held its biennial 31st General Convention in Antwerp, Belgium. There were over 600 attendee's, from 35 countries. Key note speakers, discussed, anti-semitism, freedom of religious expression in Europe. Additional sessions focused on the alarming centralization of the Far-right voices in European politics, alongside exploration and workshops regarding methods of maintaining and enriching European Jewish Identities delivered by International experts.

In September 2019, the CER held the 'Young Rabbis Seminar' in London for three days. Almost fifty Rabbis attended from across Europe. The seminar focused on issues affecting communities across Europe. Topics included Jewish identity and strategies for supporting victims of abuse within the Jewish community. The CER considers it is a key priority to provide the next generation of rabbinical leaders with the right guidance and advice on matters that affect Jewish communities across Europe. More than ever before we must ensure that our communities are properly supported and seminars like this help to ensure that our Rabbis are duly equipped.

The CER's Lo Tishkach European Jewish Cemeteries Initiative has continued to record and collate all known data on Europe's Jewish burial grounds in an online database, so that it is readily available and easily accessible to everyone. The main purpose of this is to preserve the historical and physical record of the graves across Europe and determine any potential threat to their present and future existence. The database now stands at over 11,000 individual records of cemeteries and mass graves.

The CER looks forward to assisting in many more projects in Europe.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The present level of reserves is adequate to support the continuation of our activities and the trustees consider the financial position of the Charity to be satisfactory.

The Statement of Financial Activities shows a net deficit for the year of £3,910 and our reserves stand at £33,735 in total.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

There has been 2 trustees throughout the period. Any new appointments are at the recommendation of the board.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new trustees are given, in the view of the board, sufficient training and have enough knowledge of their specific field to understand the nature of the charity and fully comply with the charity's objectives.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
