STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a constitution and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our objective firmly remains benefitting the public through helping relieve the suffering of cats in need of shelter, care, veterinary treatment, rehabilitation and eventual rehoming. The charity provides the infrastructure for such care both in its rehoming hub in Greenwich and increasingly through a volunteer fostering network across Greater London and North Kent. The registered charity address, a building that is leased and has been repurposed to house both a cat only veterinary practice with in-house staff quarters and a new rehoming hub, was completed this year (2019) and is ready for veterinary equipment installations.

In addition, the charity yearly allocates significant human resource and time to educating the public in providing prompt and better care to owned cats, strays, abandoned cats, community cats and feral colonies, with a view to controlling the numbers of cats in our area of influence. The charity has been very active at advocating and facilitating the logistics of neutering of all cats, as a means of preventing cruelty and suffering among cats and relieving the burden of care from well-intended, under-resourced members of public. The charity has also been involved in an annual trip abroad in aid of like-minded, poorly resourced cat charities, to advocate neutering among stray and feral cat populations, provide advice, knowhow and hands-on help, with a nominal number of socialised street cats, some in need of specialist veterinary care, transferred, rehabilitated and adopted in the U.K., an activity fully funded by charity sponsors.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

Strategic expansion to North London

The charity maintains the lease of its site in Palmers Green, North London. During the year we completed the repurposing of the building interior and successfully collaborated with a specialist recruiter to identify a suitable head veterinary surgeon for the new vet clinic. We subsequently identified a head vet nurse who will complete the starting staff for the clinic in early 2020.

By December 2019, the Head Vet&RVN team selected were tasked to advise on the technical installation needs of the repurposed building as well as start work on regulatory compliance for the clinic, thus adding their technical expertise and experience in getting the project to full servicing of the veterinary needs of the Catcuddles felines at the initial launch stage. The veterinary clinic staff will be free from current employment obligations by the end of March 2020, at which point the charity is scheduled to open its facilities to charity cats first, followed by cats in emergencies in custody of other charities and rescue groups, with the ultimate goal to open doors to the general public by autumn 2020.

The aim is to cover veterinary needs not just to our members, volunteers and supporters, but most importantly to the general public, with markedly affordable veterinary care and further financial incentives for clinic clients to become life-long supporters, sponsors or volunteers.

Volunteers

Volunteers are the driving force and key resource of the charity. We encourage all members of our charity to engage in some form of volunteering so that more can be achieved per £1 donated. The expanding community-based volunteer team of the charity is the key reason of the expansion of work and increase in the number of cats helped, neutered, rehabilitated and rehomed. All tasks and roles in the charity are volunteer-based. The project management function is carried out by the founder Evina Koroni, who is also Head of Feline Welfare and Strategy for the charity.

The charity has maintained its volunteer fostering network to more areas in Greater London, and has been thus enabled to help more cats in need.

DETAILED STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 25% on reducing balance Fixtures and Fittings - 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
