Our residential centre at Whittonstall continues to meet the needs of both our members and those from other counties, movements and agencies. Improvements are made year on year to keep it up to standard and we've had plenty bookings as a result.

Northumbersland Guide Association continues to provide a variety of opportunities for all its members receive look forward to the many veents planned this year. We are grateful to all the support that our members receive from their family and friends in order that they can commit to their units and give the girls the amazing opportunities that they do.

We are grateful to the Sir James Knott and W A Handley Charity Trusts and the Hexham Lions for a grant of £1,250 towards repairs at Pasture House, for their support to Ciriguiding Northumberland.

#### Financial Review

The Norhumberland County Quide Association forms part of the Guide Association and a large proportion of the annual scription paid by Northumberland members is credited to the Quide Association and North East England. The Quide Association, the national organisation and North East England, the regional body, give general support and guidance to Northumberland County Guide Association. In turn Northumberland County gives support to the Divisions within the county.

Significant levels of the Associations funds comprise of tangible fixed assets, which after the capital spend and depreciation decreased to £213,097 (£217,207). The buildings of St Oswald House (HQ) at Cramington and Pasture House (residential accommodation at Whittonstall), as well as all the equipment at Pastures House comprise the bulk of our tangible assets.

The current policy of the Association is to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds, which equates to no more than six months unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time and bearing in mind the two properties in ownership. The reserves, after this provision remain adequate and the balance on net current assets of £73,127 exceeds this target.

Our various funds resulted as follows:

Whittonstall – (Pasture House), income in 2019 had decreased slightly to £12,334 from the previous years £12,614, 2018 had seen a higher level of booking compared to previous years, bookings in 2019 had returned to the expected levels in line with previous years but the fund also benefitted from a grant of £1,508 to wards repair costs from Hexham Lions. Net expenditure increased to £1,771 from £13,082 in 2018, an increase of £4,689 mainly resulting from repair costs, site maintenance and higher electricity charges.

The Springboard Fund is a restricted fund which is provided by an anonymous donor for £1,000 per year, which can only be allocated to Girl Guides. The income was fully sperit.

Trust income remains at £4,750 from the support of Sir James Knott and W A Handley Charity Trusts.

Leaders have embraced the new programme which became mandatory in September 2019, offering a wide range of activities to cover the themes of take action, know yourself, skills for my future, be well, express myself and have adventures.

A County event was held for all Brownie groups at Alnwick Castle. The girls and leaders enjoyed a day of broomstick lessons, a dragons quest, exploring the eastle grounds and the inside of the castle. Rolling down the castles embankments was very popular! It was a very memorable and enjoyable day for all those that attended.

Many units enjoyed residential events and members have had experiences both home and abroad. The county welcomed a group of girl scours from Japan who received home hospitality and enjoyed a camp at our county campair at Whittenstall. Leating friendships were made. We are hoping for a reciprocal visit to lapan in a few graps' time.

Our volunteer leaders continued to attend trainings organised by the county on all aspects of the Ciribuiding programme. Sectional training sessions, First Response courses and personal development opportunities were planned, taking into account the needs and requests of members. Safeguarding was very high profile in our training programme to meet the compliance requirements of Ciribuiding and the ever-changing needs of society.

Some of our young members are working towards the Queen's Guide award, the highest award in guiding, and some members have completed the Chief Guide Award.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2019

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### Basis of accounting

Northumberland County Guide Association constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reponting Standard applicable to chartics preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charties Act 2011, and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The charity does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 (section 1A).

#### ncome Recognition

Voluntary income and donations are included in incoming resources when the charity becomes entitled to the funds. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be achieved then the income is deferred until the donor's conditions have been fulfilled.

The income from fundralaing ventures is shown gross with associated costs included in fundraising costs.

#### Expenditure recognition

Assources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accrual basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered.

Fundraising expenditure comprises the cost of inducing people to contribute financially to the charity. This includes the cost of staging fundraising events and lottery prizes.

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities or fundraising ventures, and include office costs, governance costs and other administration.

#### Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at open market value at the balance sheet date. Revaluation surpluses and defloits are shown as unrealised gains and losses in the Statement of Financial Activities, and are recognised as part of the overall movement in charitable funds.

Depresation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their costs less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

#### 2. Trustees remuneration
