ANNUAL REPORT

Structure, Governance and Management

This charity is governed by the Scout Association Royal Charter 4 January 1912.

All parents/carers of members are eligible to become Council members. Potential trustees are nominated and approved by the Scout Group Council.

Officers are normally appointed by the Scout Group Council. Training of new trustees and council members is by meetings with other trustees and issue of proceural documentation.

Day to day management of the scout group is under the direction of the scout group leader, supported by his section leaders.

The Scout Group Council met regularly throughout the year to oversee the management of the scout group. The group scout leader and section leaders are represented at the Council meeting.

The trustees continually examine the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen the risks.

Objectives, Achievements and performance

As is set out in the the governing document of the scout movement as a whole, 8th Penwortham St Teresa's Scout Group has at its core the following objective:

To promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

In order to achieve this objective, each section meets on a weekly bais in term time in order to undertake a programme of group activities. In addition, from time to time, activities such as sectio camps are offered to members.

Each section collects subscriptions, and, after overheads, these are spent on group activities.

In addition, the whole group participates in fundraising activities throughout the year, which involve the community and St Teresas's Parish. Funds raised are re-invested in improving the facilities and equipment for the group and in subsidising group events.

The group has invested funds in building and equipping a purpose built scout HQ, as such, is committed to ensuring that sufficient funds are set aside for repairs, renewals and overheads. Significant investment in upgreated hut and improving the externl grounds to provide a wider range of on-site activities has been made during the provides opportunities for all of the groups to take part in activities throughout the year.

During the year, the group continued to offer a weekly meeting during the term time for each section. In addition, beavers, cubs and scouts took part in in camping trips during school holidays and other events includi Bowlander and Moonlight Walk. All sections participated in fundraising events and, as a result of this, the group was able to purchase additional equipment for activities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity has net income this year of £390 (2018: net expenditure of £1,823) as shown in the receipts and payments account on page 5.

The charity seeks to hold sufficient reserves to ensure that the Scout HQ can be adequately maintained and improved and to ensure that the group is able to respond to requests for group activities which cannot be funded by parents. The group also provided accommodation for the community farmer's market which is held monthly. This market is vauable to the community and was at risk of ceasing due to lack of appropriate accommodation. A rental fee is charged. The income from this is used to support the development of the scout hut and grounds so that more activities can be provided.

During the year, grounds at the HQ have been significantly renovated to provide an outdoor facility for all men Details of assets retained by the charity for their use are shown on page 5.
