- 2. To provide a wide range of health fitness, recreational, educational, and social activities.
- 3. To manage and maintain the new facility for activities promoted by the charity in furtherance of the above objectives.

In planning our activities for the year the Trustees kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustee meetings.

The main activities during the year were:

- 1. The planning and design of a new Community Facility to replace the ageing Village Hall and Cricket Pavilion.
- 2. The successful planning application for the new facility.
- 3. Fund raising to finance the design, planning application and construction of the new facility.

When constructed the new Community Facility will benefit the inhabitants of Culworth Village and surrounding area, in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Covid-19 has had a major impact on this project. Rural facilities such as that proposed have become increasingly important as more people choose to work remotely. People are likely to travel less, will work from home more and be more reliant on local community facilities to provide sporting, recreational and social activities.

Covid-19 has also closed off many sources of capital grants. Those organisations that have available funds are focusing on providing support to existing beneficiaries.

During the year, the main achievements of the Charity were:

- Successful completion of the planning application process with South Northants Council. Planning consent was granted December 2019.
- 2. Following the successful planning application, the focus was on raising funds to finance this exciting opportunity.
- 3. Significant grant applications were submitted to:
 - South Northants Council. Unfortunately after 3 separate applications we have been unsuccessful in obtaining funding.
 - Sport England grant application £150k. We have been given an initial grant of £10k to develop our application further.
- 4. We continue to review all options for fund raising.
