TRUSTEES' REPORT for the year ended 29 February 2020

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 29 February 2020.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities SORP (FRS102) - Second Edition October 2019.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee.

Trustees are appointed by ordinary resolution of the members in general meeting and are inducted and trained by existing trustees.

None of the members of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the members of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up, while they are still members or within a year of membership ceasing.

The trustees make the decisions of the charity.

The charity has links with other water foundations across the world to widen its influence and research in order to further meet its charitable objectives. These links do not constitute related parties as deemed by the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and Activities

The Charity's objects are:

- to promote, for the benefit of the public, the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment, with a non-exclusive focus on enhancing the capacity of water to support life and otherwise improving the quality of water,
- to promote public health, by carrying out research and developing ecologically supportive technology and methods in domestic, agricultural, industrial and natural situations for the benefit of local communities and the public generally.
- to advance the education of the public in relation to the life-supporting capacities and other characteristics of water with a non-exclusive focus on ways of thinking developed by JW Goethe and Rudolf Steiner.

The trustees have paid due regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

TRUSTEES' REPORT for the year ended 29 February 2020

Achievements & Performance

Overview

The Foundation for Water consolidated its still modest yet improved financial position while focusing on its Energizing Water research programme with scientific associates in Sweden during the 2019-20 year.

Research

The Foundation has continued to undertake thorough scientific research with the Swedish Akloma Laboratories into Stage 2 Phase 1 of the project with expectation of publication of its research in the prestigious Water Journal in the USA during 2020, as the culmination of five years of research work. By the end of this operational year the manuscript was being peer reviewed by three scientists on recommendation of the journal. Our main line of research is into 'energizing water' as influenced by dynamic flow, funded primarily by the German Software AG Stiftung and private donors. Our aim is work with our with our funders SAGST to influence water policy in the EU and UK environmental planning departments. We have started to plan to take the present Stage 2 Phase 1 research into a Stage 2 Phase 2 programme by repeating the experiment in shortened form but with the addition of plant growth trials.

Education

Foundation for Water ran several seminars on environmental consciousness and water for the local public during this year. The ground floor studio space and what was the laboratory have been adapted into teaching spaces with the middle floor seminar and kitchen also rented out to other groups for income.

Staff

This year we continued to hire the same part time office administrator and part-time director. We also hired a part-time scientist for the energy in water research and are outsourcing research to Sweden.

Planning and Finances

The Foundation has continued to consolidate its regular income this year. Its rental income has improved again for a further year, with savings building up for building maintenance tasks in the coming year.

Assets

The Foundations' assets, consisting mainly of a library and research archives, of scientific and educational equipment has been reorganized further. The building had a full repaint of the exterior by professional painters, with various parts of the cladding and window frames upgraded by a carpenter.

Special Circumstances

We already knew early in the year because of our contacts in Asia that it was only a matter of time before the Covid pandemic would affect our onsite operations and we started to make plans to successfully manage these extraordinary circumstances.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

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NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS For the year ended 29 February 2020

1 Accounting Policies

Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and comply with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and in accordance with the financial reporting standards for smaller entities (FRSSE) and the Companies Act 2006.

Reporting currency

The accounts are prepared in GBP, which is the principal operating currency of the company.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life, as follows:

A loan from Software AG Stiftung of DM500,000 in 2001, in the form of a restricted covenant, guaranteed on the Foundation for Water's building for as long as it is used to support water related research and education in line with John Wilkes' work, and to be converted to a donation at a rate of 4% (£7,700) annually over 25 years on a straight line basis. The total as of 28 February 2020 is £46,200.

A mortgage is also held on the building, including accumulated interest, of £98,607 (2019 £98,838) by the family of a Trustee, Mr Thomas Wilkes. Interest is payable on the loan at 4.5% per annum.

A Trustee, Professor C Giorgetti, has made an interest free loan to the Foundation, totalling £21,800 (2019 £21,800).
