ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHARITY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

Aim and Purposes

The primary object of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) is the promotion of the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the doctrines and practices of the Church of England. The statutory function of the PCC is to co-operate with its ministers in promoting in the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

Objectives and activities

When planning activities the PCC considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and in particular the guidance on charities seeking the advancement of religion. In particular the PCC tried to help ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our Parish community with activity that addressed this need through:

- Worship and prayer
- Pastoral care and support for people living in the Parish
- Missionary and outreach work

To facilitate the activities it was/is important to maintain the fabric of the Church buildings and premises for which the PCC is responsible. A substantial amount of energy was directed towards improving the welcome and facilities the parish offers to the wider community for whom we care and support through good and difficult times.

Achievements and Performance

The PCC engaged in the oversight of Mission Action Planning, safeguarding and health and safety, which ensured that good standards were maintained. PCC meetings received reports and information on activity items including Deanery Synod, Dunstable Churches Together, Dunstable Street Pastors and Dunstable Foodbank.

Many adults and young people attending regular activities are encouraged to join the Parish Electoral Roll and vote for Churchwardens and officers of the PCC and DCC's. In 2019 a new Electoral Roll was created, comprising 193 people.

The PCC worked to support as many people as possible to worship at our churches and to become part of the Parish community in Dunstable. The PCC maintained an overview of worship throughout the Parish and looked to improve on how our services could involve the many communities and groups that live within the Parish. Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer, scripture, music and sacrament.

Chaplaincy services were provided to two local secondary school academies as part of the Rev'd Tim Davis's duties.

Financial review

The PCC Treasurer co-ordinated the volunteer treasurers of the three DCC's and to ensure that financial records were maintained for the preparation of annual accounts for the churches and consequently the consolidated accounts for the Parish.

Financial review for 2019

In 2019 the net assets of the Parish increased by £24,880 to £831,523 (2018: £806,643).

Total income of all funds for the year was £401,565 which increased by £116,667 from £284,898 in 2018. This was mainly due to grants totalling £92,014 received for the tower repairs at the Priory Church but also £35,500 of legacies compared to £16,200 received last year.

Total expenditure of all funds for the year was £380,001 an increase of £108,699 from 2018 of which £94,223 related to the tower repairs.

Of the above income for unrestricted funds was £291,660 of which £192,129 came from voluntary income including planned giving of gift aid donations, income tax recoverable, other planned giving, sundry donations and legacies. Church activities included £48,361 for hall lettings and £16,102 fees received for weddings and funerals. Fund raising brought in £15,876 and rental income from the freehold property £14,400.

Expenditure on unrestricted funds was £271,186 of which the major cost was £145,979 being the Parish's quota contribution to the Diocese of St Albans. Other expenditure incurred was £27,608 for Staff Costs, £41,476 for church running, maintenance and upkeep of services and £25,404 for church halls' running/maintenance costs.

Restricted funds income of £108,514 in the main was the £92,014 relating to the tower repairs.

Net movement on funds for the Parish is summarised as follows:

Unrestricted Funds net income £ 20,474

Restricted Funds net expenditure £ 301

Endowment Funds net income £ 4,707

Total Net Income £ 24,880

An adjustment has been made to move £127,481 of bequests from unrestricted funds to restricted funds. This is where bequests have been left to "the vicar and church wardens" of specific churches but with no further restriction on its use.

Reserves carried forward at 31 December 2019 for unrestricted funds for general purposes were £574,896 of which £64,994 had been allocated for designated funds leaving a net balance of £509,902. Fixed assets account for £329,259 of this leaving current assets of £180,643. It should be noted that fixed assets include a current selling valuation of £320,000 for the clergy house at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable which was rented out during 2019.

Safeguarding

Throughout the year, the PCC complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to House of Bishops' guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults).

Structure, governance and management

The Parish of Dunstable is responsible for and comprises the PCC and three District Church Councils (DCCs), of the Priory Church of St Peter, St Augustine of Canterbury and St Fremund the Martyr. There is also a Local Ecumenical Partnership (LEP) with St Katherine of Genoa United Reformed Church (URC).

The full PCC held four meetings during the year. There were a further four meetings of the Standing/Finance Committee. The Annual Parish Church Meeting was held on 29 April 2019 at the Church of St Fremund the Martyr to approve the accounts and various reports for 2018, together with elections of PCC members.

Until 31 October 2019, the ordained and licensed staff comprised Team Vicars the Rev'd Ricky Turner, Rev'd Tim Davis and Parish Readers Mrs Vanessa Bradley and Dr. Johan Schoeman. The Rev'd Rachel Phillips was installed as Team Rector on 31 October 2019.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019 set out on pages two to fifteen.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The church's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The church's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is needed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The PCC is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 and in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 governing the individual accounts of PCC's, with the Regulations' "true and fair view" provisions and applicable accounting standards and the 2016 version of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP(FRS102)).

ASSETS

Consecrated and benefice property

In so far as consecrated and benefice property of any kind is excluded from the statutory definition of 'charity' by Section 10(2) (a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011 such assets are not capitalised in the financial statements.

Moveable church furnishings

These are capitalised at cost and depreciated over their useful economic life other than where insufficient cost information is available. In this case the item is not capitalised, but all items are included in the Church's inventory.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £100 each. They are valued at cost or else, for gifts -in-kind, at a reasonable estimate of their open market on receipt.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the capitalised cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives depending on the type of asset as follows:

Church moveable furnishings/equipment5 - 20 yearsChurch and hall fixtures and fittings5 - 20 yearsOffice equipment4 - 10 yearsComputers/printers4 years

Land and buildings - the PCC adopts the policy regarding the clergy house (temporarily let) at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable of accounting at 'current market value' at each year ending 31 December.

Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange or whose value derives from them are valued at market value at the year end.

Short term deposits

These are the cash held deposits either with the CCLA or at the bank.

FUNDS

Unrestricted Funds

These represent the remaining income funds of the PCC that are available for spending on the general purposes of the PCC, including amounts designated by the PCC for fixed assets for its own use or for spending on a future project and which are therefore not included in its 'free reserves' as disclosed in the trustees report.

Restricted Funds

These are income funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions provided are shown in the notes to the accounts.

Endowment Funds

These are restricted funds that must be retained as trust capital either permanently or subject to a discretionary power to spend capital as income, and where the use of any income or other benefit derived from the capital may be restricted or unrestricted. Full details are shown in the notes to the accounts.

Freehold land and buildings represents the clergy house (currently let) located at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable. This property was valued at 31 December 2019 without change from 2018.

Functional charitable land and buildings are not included in the balance sheet. This comprises the Priory Church Hall which has a valuation of approximately £200,000 (1997). The land was acquired by deed of grant from The Crown Estate in 1839 to be used as a school and later in 1923 the use was changed to that of church and similar meetings. Should this change, outside of those permitted by the grants, there would be a right of re-entry to the land registry and The Crown Estate. Therefore no commercial gain would be realised.
