(d) two ninths to the charity known as Sir John Cotton's Educational Foundation (311821);

(e) two ninths to the charity known as Sir John Cotton's Educational (Flitwick Charity) (307435).

Section D - Achievements and performance

The Trustees continue to oversee the investment of the Charity's funds and to consider ways of maximising the funds available for distribution. The land at Maulden Road, Flitwick continues to be rented out to generate funds for the charity.

The Charity's main funds are held and managed by Brooks MacDonald Asset Management and are reviewed by the Trustees annually.

Section E - Financial Review

In 2017 basic income for the charity came from:

Rent - £3,516, Wayleave fee for use of land £473, Dividends & Interest from investments £5,274.

A deficit of £10,759 was made through the selling and buying of investments and the total investment fund showed a healthy increase in value of £17,209 from the start of the year.

Costs of administration amounted to £3,834 over the year.

Distributions of £3,795 were paid out to beneficiaries.

Overall income over expenditure amounted to £8,084.

As an exceptional item, a net £29,630 was received from a Land Promotion Agreement on which there have been no further developments.
