

Welcome!

Our report this year focuses on the expansion of our youth provision through our PRIDE Youth Network programme. We are delighted to have received a third year of funding from Children in Need to continue expanding our reach to over 120 campaigning groups of young people to lead the youth movement for LGBT+ inclusion.

The funding has enabled us to provide each group with a trained E&C trainer to facilitate sessions and monitor their progress through a series of targets aimed to create positive change within the school and local community through activism.

We are very proud to have given our network further opportunities to engage with each other by sharing their successes on social media and through our PRIDE Youth Network Conference, which this year was supported by the National Education Union, Sony and School Leader Development. The conference provided a day of interactive workshops for the pupils, panel debates, key speakers and stalls including Gay's the Word bookshop.

We were thrilled to present 30 more schools with our PRIDE in Inclusion Award, including 15 in Durham supported by Durham County Council. We send huge congratulations to all the schools and welcome their hard work in building a future of inclusion and social justice for young people, teachers, parents and communities.

Thanks to a new partnership with John Lyon's Charity we are now able to expand our reach to schools, colleges and organisations in Westminster, Hammersmith & Fulham, Ealing and Brent over the next three years. We have begun our pioneering Award Programme with 10 schools so far and delivered whole borough training. We are very much looking forward to the rest of the journey.

Additionally, our reach continues to expand internationally through the International School of Zug & Luzern in Switzerland and more recently through a partnership with Pedagogue Education in Bangkok, Thailand which allows us to reach schools in South East Asia.



Data for this evaluation is drawn from surveys of teachers and students, participant observation and interviews with volunteer PYN facilitators, a Mentimeter digital response survey, focus groups with students at their schools and at the PYN conference, evidence folders submitted by the schools. The set of evaluation codes is outlined on page 11.

1. Enabling leadership in inclusive practices and decision making

Our school has just recently brought in gender inclusive toilets and we are forwarding a motion to bring in pronouns on emails of staff

3. Enabling personal development and positive self-esteem

The PYN does help, because people are accepting. My learning has improved since I have joined

2. Developing an awareness of a commitment to challenge social institutions and environments which can present as hostile

Pupils raised that perhaps there could be a specific page on the code of conduct about challenging HBT/Racist language as there is a banned items list but not a banned language list

4. Work-related skills development

The students also did fundraisers, and decided as a team what they would do with the money. One group did a rainbow cake bake sale

Problems that I faced

I had comments and names thrown at me at school for just under 2 years (from Year 8 to end of Year 9) by the same person each time, to the point where some days I felt scared to come to school. This person transferred schools and that's when the homophobic comments stopped. I didn't want to tell anyone about it because I didn't know who to go to and for the most part of it I was still in the closet to some people and didn't know how to tell anyone.

How the school helped me to be who I am

At the start of year 9, a new school club was introduced. It was a safe place for anyone who was part of the LGBTQ+ community and allies, for me it was somewhere I could be myself without the fear that someone was going to judge me. It was every Thursday and it was just somewhere we could come up with ideas on how to make the school more inclusive and where we could just socialise and play snooker.

How do I feel now?

Now, I know who I can go to if I need help, which is comforting to know, as I didn't have that before. I have people who accept and support me and I now accept myself and I am not as confused as I was before. I am able to go to school without feeling as scared as I did before because I know I have people at school who can help me.

What advice would I give to other young LGBTQ+ pupils?

Some advice that I would give to other young LGBTQ+ pupils would be to find someone that you can trust completely, whether it be a teacher, a family member or a friend, just so you have at least one person you can talk to about it, so you're not bottling up your feelings. I would also recommend finding somewhere you can be yourself and where you feel safe, like for me it was that school club, but for you it might be an LGBTQ+ group chat or forum, or maybe even just watching some inspirational youtube videos so you can educate yourself or just feel included. However I also think that if you are having any problems at all whether it be bullying, confusion or anything bothering you, that you ask for help, because it can make a difference.


