As a newly registered Charity the Trustees, advised by Edward Connor Solicitors who supported our registration, all Trustees completed the required reading for Trustees. In addition, specific Trustees undertook the recommended reading relevant to our organisation.

The Trustees together form the Leadership Team of the Church, which meets on a regular basis, at least monthly, to plan the activities of the Church, to make decisions on matters of general concern, and to determine how funds are spent.

The emergence of the Coronavirus Pandemic towards the end of the period under review is not considered to have raised significant risks to the sustainability of the Charity. The Church is led and run by volunteers, with no employed staff. This limits the extent of fixed costs to be covered by income. Also, the team approach to leadership and ministry reduces dependency on key individuals.

The objects of the Church are:

- 1. The advancement of the Christian faith, primarily, but not exclusively, within Mayfield, East Sussex and the surrounding neighbourhood; and
- 2. such other charitable purposes as shall put into practice the Christian faith, including: the prevention and relief of need, hardship and sickness; the advancement of education; and the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life;

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The Church Leadership is committed to welcoming as many people as possible into the life and activities of the Church. In planning the activity of the Church, the Leadership Team has considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit. The main activities of Colkins Mill Church can be summarised as follows:

- Public worship has taken place each week in the Church, with a congregation between 30 and 50 people, together with a small Sunday School for children.
- Three mid-week groups have met regularly in homes to worship and learn together from the Bible, and to support one another in prayer and fellowship.
- During school term-times two mid-week youth clubs have been run, open to all local young people of appropriate ages. These clubs provide a fun environment for games and social interraction, but also include teaching from the Bible and discussion of relevant issues from a Christian perspective.
- A monthly celebration for people with learning difficulties has been held with a regular attendance of 30 to 40 people from a number of local care homes.
- The Church maintains active relationships with mission partners and Christian organisations working elsewhere in the UK and the World, and provides financial and prayer support.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Good progress was made with a building refurbishment programme, with the appointment of a builder, and commencement of the renovation work during the period. The total programme is budgeted to cost £100,000, and is being financed from a legacy received from a former member of the congregation. The purpose of the renovation is to modernise and open up the back rooms of the Church, to create a flexible, welcoming environment that will enable the Church to fulfil its mission more effectively. Key features are to include an attractive lounge area, a modern kitchen with an open "coffee bar" feel, and patio doors opening onto a back terrace.

Three visitor-friendly guest services were held: opportunities to invite friends and neighbours to experience the Church and hear the message of the Gospel. One of these was "Carols by Candlelight", which had a capacity congregation.

A team of Church members cooked and served Christmas lunch to people in the village who would have been otherwise alone at Christmas. It was a happy and successful event, with some 20 people at table.

Occasional special guest events were held, including a lantern making craft morning, developing relationships in the community and providing opportunities to share the Christian message.

The number of children attending the youth clubs was strong, with a weekly average of 15 at the club for school years 4 to 6, and 12 at the club for school years 7 to 10.

During the period the Church was able to make grants to Christian organisations totalling £3,600. These organisations were CARE (Christian Action Research and Eduction), Tear Fund, Bethnal Green Spear Trust and Ichthus Christian Fellowship's Community Table project serving the homeless. Support to missionaries working in South Africa, USA and India totalled £12,616, of which £9,316 came from restricted donations.

The social lockdown for the Coronavirus pandemic commenced in March 2020, and the Church was able to switch immediately to running weekly services on Zoom, and also mid-week home groups on the same technology. Levels of attendance were maintained, indeed some of our international friends were able to join these on-line services.
