The Trustees are ultimately responsible for the policies, activities and assets of the Charity. They meet during the year to review the developments with regard to the Charity, its activities and make important decisions.

## **Objectives and activities**

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The Charity aims to empower young people to achieve their potential by providing them with positive life paths. In planning the activities of the Charity for the year, the Trustees have considered the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charities Commission. The charity runs four main programmes. Fight for a Better Life is a leadership development course for young people who have not been in education, employment or training ("NEET"). The charity is currently seeking funding for this work. 'Dreams and Passions' is a discretionary grant fund that supports young people who require specific equipment in order to take up opportunities

they are passionate about. Trustees undertake a selection process to decide the recipients of this funding. The charity has developed a one-to-one mentoring initiative to support young people at risk of engaging in the criminal justice system, using schools as referral agencies for this work. The fourth programme run by the charity is a set of workshops delivered to classes of schoolchildren on the criminal justice system, substance abuse and a range of other topics.
