1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Fund Accounting: The Charity's general funds consist of funds which the charity may use for its purpose at its discretion. The charity has, at present, no restriced funds which can only be spent within specific restriction(s) of the donor.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and reporting to Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities (issued on 16 July 2014), the Financial reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and with the Charities Act 2011.

2. SPONSORSHIP IN KIND

Several sponsors most generously provide additional sponsorship in kind as well as cash funding. This includes printing and publicity material and speakers at events. Some entrants have also provided venues for seminars and awards, either free or at a nominal price. It should be noted that the Trustees and Judges give a significant amount of their time to running the charity, for which they receive no remuneration.

3 DISCLOSURE OF PAYMENTS TO "RELATED PERSONS"

Charity law now permits payments to "related persons" without specific permission from the Charity Commissioners, provided strict procedures are followed in absolute accordance with these procedures. Currentlt within the Anglia in Bloom, no such payments are made.

4 DISCLOSURE OF EXPENSES PAID TO TRUSTEES/DIRECTORS

A total of £7,969.14 (2018 - £8,465.12) has been reimbursed to Trustees, representing their mileage allowance and subsistence when attending meetings and judging entrants and when on the ordinary course of the business of the charity.
