The sessions are once a week for 3 hours at a cost of £10 each. Staged a production with a staunchly feminist angle, followed by a production of a Spanish play with English titles, with audiences of mixed linguistic background. Reserved nights for members of Unite Union. We have continued to run our free weekly cinema night screening several series of films by different directors. We still offer budget priced rehearsal space with the addition of a piano which has increased in popularity and is used mostly by local theatre companies and drama teachers. Finally, we continue to sell second hand plays and books on theatre as well as politics, philosophy and selected fiction for an average of three pounds each.
