To that end a representative of The Wilson is invited to attend committee meetings of the Trustees, and Trustees also liaise with staff at The Wilson.

Risk management. At each of its meetings the committee of Trustees reviews the financial situation of the charity.

The purpose of the charity is the educating of the public by the support and assistance of The Wilson, Cheltenham Art Gallery and Museum ("the Gallery"), and in making loans or gifts to the Gallery, and in purchasing, acquiring or contributing to the purchase or acquisition of pictures, sculptures, works of art, costume, photographs, books and other works of artistic historical scientific or general public interest for loans or gifts to the Gallery.

The charity has organised lectures and outings for the education of members and the public. There were nine lectures on artistic and cultural subjects and five outings to historic and artistic locations. The profits from these events are used to benefit The Wilson.

In accordance with section 17 of the Charities Act 2011, the Trustees have satisfied themselves that the charity's purpose and activities provide a public benefit.

During 2019-20 the charity contributed £45,992 in support of The Wilson. This comprised: £35,000 for the Feasibility Study for Phase 2 of The Wilson redevelopment; £420 for the pop-up cinema; £1870 for refurbishment of the roof terrace; and £8,702 for equipment to enable reaccreditation of The Wilson by Arts Council England.

The restricted reserves are only available for use in accordance with the donors' express intentions.

The general reserve is available to enable the charity to meet its aim of supporting The Wilson. Specifically, the charity aims to keep a reserve to cover at least 12-18 months' charitable expenditure.

Independent Examiner's report to the trustees of The Friends of the Wilson

I report on accounts for the year ended 31st March 2020, which are annexed.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed.
