TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2020.

Structure, governance and management

The charity was established under its constitution on 29 November 2016 and registered as a charity with the Charity Commission on that date.

The appointment of trustees is set out in the Constitution.

The recruitment of new trustees is periodically undertaken by the Board, which follows an open and fair recruitment process taking due account of both the skills and needs of the charity and the desire for its membership to reflect the diversity of the local population.

The Charity and its property are managed and administered by a board of trustees, which can have between three and fifteen members.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects are the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation by providing facilities for recreational and leisure-time activities.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

Achievements and performance

In our third year of running we feel we have gone from strength to strength. This year we have focussed on training people with new skills and offering care to the vulnerable, we have worked alongside our partners to provide training to the unemployed, both local and in South Tyneside and people who wish to enter the care sector.

We have increased the numbers of people with special needs and dementia, offering bespoke activities to help them gain confidence, this includes creating a purpose-built woodwork room to help people with dementia. All of this whilst still providing a wide range of activities for the community.

Next year sees a whole new set of obstacles with an imminent Covid pandemic which will naturally have an impact on both the numbers of people attending the centre and our income. We have invested money to be ready to open and be Covid safe to the local community, lets hope we can survive such a huge blow.

Financial review

The receipts and payments account on page 4 shows a surplus of receipts to payments on unrestricted funds of £8,279 for the year ended 31 March 2020 after taking into account a further contribution of £1,212 from the original association.

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months' expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in income, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.
